## FROM THE MAYOR'S CORNER

Dear Surfsiders,

Spring is here and once again Team Surfside will be out in full force, participating in Miami-Dade County's Department of Environmental Resources Management (DERM) "BAYNANZA Clean Up Day", scheduled for Saturday, April 16th from 9:00 a.m. - Noon. I encourage all of our residents to come out and lend a hand with this important project, as we work together to clean up our beach area and care for our natural resources. If you are interested in volunteering you may register on line at [www.miamidade.gov/derm/baynanza](http://www.miamidade.gov/derm/baynanza), or if you require further information please call DERM at 305-372-6789.

Through our mutually collaborative efforts, we will ensure that the Surfside business community will continue to flourish for generations to come.

Due to a marked increase in pedestrian and vehicular traffic, and because overdevelopment in the surrounding areas will continue to produce an overflow of cars and people into our neighborhoods, the Town of Surfside held a Public Workshop on Tuesday March 15th to discuss the possibility of closing down, restricting access or "gating" some of our area streets. This safety measure was suggested to residents as one of a number of possible remedies the Town is considering to combat the vehicular and pedestrian traffic concerns. As of this writing, nothing definitive has been decided. However, the Town Commission is committed to moving forward on resolving our traffic safety issues and intends to appoint residents to an advisory committee to further analyze the situation and evaluate the options.

A number of Public Workshops occurred during the month of March. The first was held on Tuesday, March 8th to discuss the Surfside Business District. A large number of proprietors were in attendance and everyone took part in a great exchange of ideas. Many issues were discussed. Fair presentations and assessments were offered throughout the Workshop. A very constructive dialogue occurred, which proved enlightening to the business representatives and the Town Commissioners. A copy of the Surfside Business Directory, published by the Surfside Tourist Bureau, was mailed last month to residents. It is provided for your convenience and reference, and I encourage everyone to patronize the proprietors in our downtown area.

On Tuesday, March 22nd a third Public Workshop was held to give residents an opportunity to meet with the Planning and Zoning Board to consider a proposal for the Adoption of a Comprehensive Landscaping Code. A number of issues were discussed including the maintenance of property, fencing and hedge sizes. The community input was a crucial first



## SURFSIDE: SAFE AND SECURE

The Surfside Police Department is initiating a new program, Surfside: Safe and Secure. It is an initiative to enhance community awareness of home and business safety. Officers are assigned to check your home or business when you are away. Whether you are gone for two weeks or eight hours, officers will come by and check to make sure that your home or business is safe from intruders. While the officers are there, they will check for things that make your home more attractive to unwelcome visitors. A Surfside: Safe and Secure card will notify you that the police officers were there, and whether or not they found any security deficiencies.

Businesses will be randomly checked as part of the program. However, if you are scheduled to be away for an extended period of time such as a vacation, you may arrange for your home to be placed on the "house check" list, and it will be monitored regularly. SURFSIDE COMMISSION HIGHLIGHTS

1. TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

The Town Manager reported that he has met with County Officials regarding the stalled Sea Oats Planting. He noted that the County has had a problem with the vendor. He stated that the County has assured that the project will start again in mid-April.

The Town Manager also reported on the walking path. He stated that the County will only continue to patch-up what currently exists and will not replace the entire stretch. He requested direction from the Commission as to whether or not to proceed with replacing the path at this time or to wait until the next budget cycle to include the improvement project in the next fiscal year. The Town Manager advised that he is reviewing various options that are available and obtaining quotes for materials for the one mile stretch of walking path. He noted that the State requires that the path must be made of break-away material. Some of the materials he is looking into are sand, pavers, or cracked concrete. By consensus, the Commission directed the Town Manager to continue to look at the costs associated with the various materials that could be used to revamp the path.

Regarding the Community Center Project, the Town Manager announced

that at a Special Meeting of the Town Commission on March 1, 2005, the Commission voted to postpone the awarding of a renovation contract for 90 days in order to study the feasibility and cost of new construction. They also voted to issue an RFQ for architectural services to study the feasibility for new construction; establish a Committee that will review the qualifications submitted in response to the RFQ; rank the firms and make a recommendation to the Commission; work with the selected firm to gain input from the residents and make recommendations to the Commission. Each Commissioner was asked to appoint two representatives to the Committee.

The Town Manager announced the following appointments to the Community Center New Construction Committee: Mitchell Kinzer, Anthony Blate, Daniel Dietch, Galen Bakken, Richard Iacobacci, Mark Blumstein, James MacKenzie, Ken Arnold, Kendra McGuire and Evelyn Jordan. Committee appointments have expressed a commitment to the process and have flexibility to attend meetings and/or workshops.

Regarding Homeland Security, the Town Manager announced that the Department has requested that the Town execute a Memorandum of

Understanding. He stated that the MOU requires a Town appointment to the Homeland Security Task Force on Immigration and Customs Enforcement.

The Town Manager also announced several public workshops scheduled for March including: a Business District Workshop, a "Gating/Street Closing" Workshop, a Proposal for the Adoption of a Comprehensive Landscaping Code Workshop, and a Workshop to Review the B1 Business District, Section 90-152 of the Surfside Zoning Code.

Regarding funding resources, the Town Manager suggested that in light of the many infrastructure projects that will be needed in the near future, he suggested that the Commission authorize him to begin the process of obtaining lobbying services and look into various funding that may be available to the Town. By consensus, the Commission directed the Town Manager to proceed.

The Town Manager announced that staff is looking at ways to provide better customer service online. The Town is currently testing a service on the website [www.town.surfside.fl.us](http://www.town.surfside.fl.us) that will allow residents to go on line and send in a request, send an e-mail to various departments, or file a complaint, etc. Residents will be able to track the status of their request or complaint, on

CODE COMPLIANCE REMINDER

Unless a vehicle belongs to the occupant of a residence, to an immediate family member, to a resident residing on the property or if a person is a bona fide guest or visitor, it is against the Surfside Code to park any vehicle in a private driveway or front yard.

If a person parks a vehicle, intermittently or continuously during a period of three weeks, and the vehicle is not registered to the occupant of the property, or to an immediate

family member, or to a resident of the household, then this will be considered a violation.

Additionally, no motor vehicle may be kept in any unpaved area of any lot or parcel within the Town.

The cooperation of all our residents is essential to maintain the attractiveness, appearance and quality of life in our community.

CITIZENS' ADVISORY: RAMP METERING TO BE INTRODUCED ON I-95

The Florida Department of Transportation is installing green & red light traffic signals on I-95 between NW 62 Street and Ives Dairy Road, as part of their efforts to improve traffic flow and congestion during peak hours. This "ramp metering system" as it is known, should be operational by late 2005 and will be in effect in both north and south directions. Traffic entering the ramps is controlled on city streets by creating "platoons" or lines of vehicles that proceed after stopping at the red signal light. The theory behind the ramp metering is that the platoons of vehicles will be broken up so that individual cars can move freely into gaps of heavy traffic. Human nature reveals that a motorist will usually not mind letting one car slip into traffic, but will speed up to not let all the cars on the entrance ramp get in front of him or her. The stop

and go system allows for a logical, controlled flow; enabling one car at a time, to enter onto the freeway.

The primary purpose of the ramp metering is to reduce the number of crashes at the merge points of traffic. It will also make it easier for drivers to enter the traffic stream. Studies have shown that it actually increases smoother traffic and commuter's overall travel time. The system will not operate 24 hours a day, but only during the busy morning and evening hours.






