## Happy Independence Day!

### FROM THE MAYOR'S CORNER

Dear Surfsiders,  
More than a few people have approached me to ask why I continue to warn against the construction of high rise buildings in Surfside since, in 2004, we passed a Charter Amendment requiring that any zoning change must be submitted to a vote of the citizens of Surfside. Through these dialogues, I have come to realize that there is a lack of understanding regarding the differences between a zoning change

and a variance. I will attempt to clear up some of the confusion.  
In Surfside, every inch of land rests in one zoning category or another. The zoning then defines the permissible use of the land. The largest portion of the Town is zoned RS-2, and basically only single family residential uses can exist in the RS-2 zoning district. There are areas along the beach that are zoned multi-family, and the permitted height is a maximum 12-story multi-family

building. If a person or group of persons bought every house in a square block of the residential zone under the RS-2 designation, and tried to build one or more 12-story buildings, they would have to seek a zoning change. The town voters would eventually be able to approve or disapprove of the change, because of the 2004 Charter Amendment.

## SURFSIDE COMMISSION HIGHLIGHTS

### 1. TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT:

The Town Manager reported that the Town has published an RFP for a Lobbyist and four bids have been received. Each of the four firms have been asked to make a presentation to the Commission at the July 12th Commission Meeting.

The Town Manager announced that the Landscaping Workshop originally scheduled for May 31st was re-scheduled to Tuesday, June 21, 2005 at 6:30 p.m. at the Town Hall Commission Chambers.

Regarding the Budget, the Town Manager reported that he is preparing a schedule for the upcoming Budget Workshops. He noted that the departments have already begun preliminary work on the 2005-2006 fiscal year Budget.

The Town Manager reported on the Community Center Project. Several Committee meetings and Public Workshops have been held and many good ideas have been suggested. The Town Manager added that representatives from the Russell Partnership Group have been present at all the workshops. The Russell Partnership Group is the architectural firm that has been hired to prepare a feasibility study to address the issue of new construction versus renovation of the Community Center. The Town Manager stated that the Committee plans to meet at the end of June. A presentation is anticipated to be made at the July 12th Commission Meeting.

IN OTHER MATTERS THE TOWN COMMISSION VOTED ON THE FOLLOWING:

2. A motion to suspend the Education Committee until a "Charter" or set of "By-Laws" could be created for the said Committee was voted on. The Charter or By-laws would outline the duties and scope of the Committee and more clearly define the activities of the

Committee. The Town Commission voted 3-1 to suspend the Education Committee.

3. The Town Commission voted to rescind the motion taken at the May 10, 2005 Commission Meeting which was to direct the Town Manager to publish an RFP to hire an Independent Auditor, to conduct a five-year forensic audit of the Town's books. The Town Commission voted 3-1 to rescind the RFP.

However, the West side of Collins Avenue is zoned for low rise, multi-family buildings that cannot exceed 3 stories. If a developer owns property on the west side of Collins Avenue, he may determine that he cannot maximize his investment unless he can construct a building of 20 stories. In this case, the developer might request a **variance** from the current zoning requirements that limit him to 3 stories, from the Town Commission. A variance is a due process procedure that safeguards a property owner from the theoretic possibility that zoning laws might render his property without value. A variance from the limitations and/or requirements of the zoning regulations can be granted by a vote of the Commission. This would not require a zoning change, and therefore, the people would not have to vote. Variances from height requirements have been quite common in surrounding communities; they are virtually non-existent in Surfside. Variances permit

providing inclusion in the Code; repealing all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith; and providing an effective date. VOTE: UNANIMOUS 4-0

5. An Ordinance of the Town of Surfside, Florida awarding a non-exclusive cable television franchise to Atlantic Broadband (Miami), LLC for a period of ten (10) years; repealing all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith; and providing an effective date. VOTE: UNANIMOUS 4-0

Second reading of these Ordinances is scheduled for the July 12, 2005 Commission Meeting.



certain owners to circumvent the land use requirements to which all others must conform.

## LIVING IN A FLOOD HAZARD AREA

**LOCAL FLOOD HAZARD** - The Town of Surfside has attained a "Class 8" Classification in the Community Rating System (CRS) for establishing flood prevention activities and the continued management of the flood prevention system. Residents may now be entitled to a 10% discount in their flood insurance premiums and a 10% discount in all subsequent years that the Town maintains participation in the CRS program. The following information is provided to suggest actions, which residents living in a flood hazard area may take, to minimize potential flood damage.

**FLOOD WARNING SYSTEM** - Any substantial flood experienced by Surfside residents will likely come from a hurricane or tropical storm. Since Surfside is on a barrier island, any storm surge is likely to flood coastal, as well as interior properties. Because of this, you should heed all hurricane and tropical storm warnings. These warnings will be broadcast through local television and radio stations, such as WFOR-Channel 4, WTVJ-Channel 6, WSVN-Channel 7, and WPLG-Channel 10, or on radio on WQAM-AM 560 or WIOD-AM 610.

**FLOOD SAFETY/PROPERTY PROTECTION** - If an evacuation is ordered, you should proceed to rapidly evacuate to a point of safety, such as a County shelter or other prearranged site. Remember that pets are not allowed in public shelters, so special arrangements should be made for them. People with special needs, who are disabled, or under a doctor's care, can register for special assistance with the Miami-Dade County Office of Emergency Management by calling (305) 513-7700. Before you evacuate, there are a number of flood safety precautions to follow. Know appropriate escape routes, turn off your electricity and gas, and close all your windows, doors, and shutters. If you have time, you can

move valuables and furniture to elevated areas that are less prone to water damage. Prepare emergency supplies of food, water, medicines, and other personal essentials to have readily available upon evacuation.

**FLOOD INSURANCE** - In preparation for the hurricane season, you should check that your flood insurance coverage is in effect. Remember that flood damage is not covered by homeowners' normal insurance. For most people, their home and its contents represent their greatest investment. Protect your property by obtaining flood insurance if you have not already done so. Flood insurance through the National Flood Insurance Program is available and information can be obtained by contacting any licensed property or casualty broker. Also remember that there is normally a 30 day waiting period for the flood insurance to take effect, so do not wait until there is a storm warning to talk to your insurance agent.


**DRAINAGE MAINTENANCE** - Another way that the Town of Surfside minimizes flood damage is by maintaining its storm drainage system. Please be reminded that it is illegal to dispose debris or yard cuttings into the storm drainage system. The storm drainage system on A1A and 96th Street, installed by the State of Florida, helps to minimize flood damage. Effective maintenance by our Public Works Department, combined with the State of Florida storm drainage system, should minimize potential flood damage.

**LOCAL FLOOD HAZARD MAP/PERMIT REQUIREMENTS** - Flood damage may be minimized by new buildings and additions adhering to the current Base Flood Elevations (BFE). In most cases in Surfside, it is 8.0 feet NGVD. However, it is advisable to obtain a written flood map determination from the Town's Building

Official showing the Base Flood Elevation required for your proposed construction, according to the exact location. Should you require the latest edition of the Elevation Certificate Form for your Surveyor's use, it is available at the Town Building and Zoning Department. Residents are encouraged to contact the Building and Zoning Department to eliminate confusion as to pertinent codes and regulations to facilitate your permit process.

**SUBSTANTIAL IMPROVEMENT REQUIREMENTS** - The "Substantial Improvement" Rule applies to all work done to an existing structure, including additions, during the preceding 5 years. If the total dollar value of this work exceeds 50% of the market value of your structure (not including the value of the land), then your entire structure will be required to be raised to base flood elevation or, if it is a commercial structure, it will be required to be flood-proofed. The Federal Government requires the Town of Surfside to have an ordinance enforcing this Rule through the Building and Zoning Department. Failure by the Town of Surfside to effectively enforce the Substantial Improvement Rule may result in the virtual unavailability of flood insurance for the Town.

For everyone's safety, both human and animal, please remember that all dogs must be kept on a leash in Surfside. Dogs are

also not allowed on the beach area or the walking path.

### Hurricane Preparedness:

Hurricane Season is here again and so is the potential for tropical force winds and frequent summer time storms. Residents are well aware that hanging tree branches and strong winds are an unfavorable mix that can cause considerable damage to our utilities, homes, cars and neighborhoods. Please

remember that all trees, or other vegetation, must be cut and maintained at 14 feet 6 inches or more above the surface of the roadway. The time to address this issue is now; not when we are facing the imminent threat of a storm.


