





TIME RESERVED FOR RESIDENTS TO ADDRESS TOWN COMMISSION



The Town Commission agreed on March 10, to set a “time certain” for the Good and Welfare portion of their meeting agenda. Good and Welfare is the opportunity for residents to speak to the Commission and their fellow Surfsiders about an issue ***not*** on the Commission meeting agenda. **The proposed time is between 8:15 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.** Residents may continue to address their elected officials ***at any time*** during the commission meetings, about any topic ***on*** the agenda.

This time frame will serve as a guideline. If Good and Welfare needs to be longer than 45 minutes it could be extended by a majority vote of the Commission. The Town Attorney explained that if Good and Welfare was reached before 8:15 p.m. in the evening, the Commission could continue with the Agenda until said time, thereby giving the Good and Welfare portion some float within the Agenda.

SURFSIDERS MAY BRING GUESTS TO MIAMI SHORES AQUATIC CENTER

Beginning **April 18, 2009**, Surfside residents may bring guests to the Aquatic Center on a **temporary, trial basis**, under the following conditions:

1. A Surfside resident, with a valid Surfside Recreation ID card, will be permitted to bring two (2) guests to the Center at any time.
2. Each Surfside guest will be required to pay \$6.00 at the gate before entering the Aquatic Center.
3. Surfside residents must accompany and remain with their guests while at the Aquatic Center.
4. Failure to adhere to all policies, rules and regulations will result in both the Surfside resident and their guest being denied admittance to the Center or in certain cases, required to leave the premises.

— SURFSIDE COMMISSION HIGHLIGHTS —

At the Commission meeting held on March 10, 2009 all Second Readings of the following Ordinances were deferred to the April 14, 2009 meeting as they had not been properly advertised:

- Removal and Proper Disposition of Animal Fecal Matter
- McMansion Ordinance
- Temporary Use and Structure Ordinance
- Planning and Zoning Board Residency Requirements for Architects

At the Commission meeting held on March 10, 2009 the following Ordinances were introduced for First Reading. Second Reading is scheduled for April 14, 2009:

1. An Ordinance of the Town Commission of the Town of Surfside, Florida amending Chapter 90 “Zoning”; Article V “Design Standards”; Section 90-56 “Fences, Walls and Hedges”; providing for severability; providing for inclusion in the Code; providing for conflicts; and providing for an effective date. **VOTE: UNANIMOUS**

2. An Ordinance amending the Code of the Town of Surfside; creating Section 2-180 (D) of the Code to Institute Pre-Tax Employee “Pick-Up” Contributions as permitted by Section 414 (H) 2 of the Internal Revenue Code; providing for severability; providing for Codification; providing an effective date.

VOTE: UNANIMOUS

3. An Ordinance of the Town Commission of the Town of Surfside, Florida amending Section 6.05 of Article VI “Rules of Procedure for Town Meetings”; providing for severability; providing for inclusion in the Code; providing for conflicts and providing for an effective date. **VOTE: UNANIMOUS**

4. An Ordinance of the Town Commission of the Town of Surfside, Florida amending Section 66-35, “Schedule of Fees” of the Code of Ordinances to establish new rates for solid waste removal to downtown commercial establishments with a 10% fee reduction which shall be effective October 1, 2009; providing for inclusion in the Code by; repealing all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith; and providing for an effective date. **VOTE: UNANIMOUS**

5. An Ordinance of the Town Commission of the Town of Surfside, Florida amending Chapter 2, “Administration” of the Town Code of Ordinances

to create and adopt Section 2-27 “Legal Defense of Public Officers, Employees and Agents”; providing for severability; providing for inclusion in the Code; and providing for an effective date. **VOTE: 4-1** (Mayor Burkett *dissenting*)

6. An Ordinance of the Town Commission of the Town of Surfside, Florida amending Article III, “Property Maintenance Standards” of Chapter 14 “Building and Building Regulations” to establish Section 14-55 “Maintenance of Vacant Lots”; providing for severability; providing for inclusion in the Code; providing for conflicts and providing for an effective date. **VOTE: UNANIMOUS**

The following Resolutions were approved:

7. A Resolution of the Town Commission of the Town of Surfside, Florida supporting amendments to the Florida Statutes to Increase Mortgage Holders’ Responsibility for delinquent Condominium, Cooperative and Homeowner Associations fees, regular assessments and special assessments on units in foreclosure and on foreclosed units; and providing for an effective date. **VOTE: UNANIMOUS**

8. A Resolution of the Town Commission of the Town of Surfside, Florida authorizing the purchase of office furniture and execute a lease of a color copier/printer/fax for the Office of the Town Attorney; authorizing the Town Manager to execute all purchase orders or other required documentation; authorizing the re-appropriation of Fund Balance (Reserves) to the General Fund; amending the Town’s Budget for Fiscal Year 2008-2009; and providing for an effective date. **VOTE: UNANIMOUS**

In other matters...

Town Attorney, Lynn Dannheisser, introduced her Law Intern, Adam Bender. He is a recent graduate of St. Thomas University and has worked for the Broward County Attorney’s Office. While he prepares for the Bar he is working for the Town “pro bono”, in exchange for tutelage from Ms. Dannheisser. In May, Adam will receive the Florida Bar City/County and Local Government Section Law Student Award.

Regarding the possible implementation of red light cameras in the Town of Surfside, the Commission decided that a date for a public workshop would be chosen and providers would be invited to present.

— SURFSIDE COMMISSION HIGHLIGHTS —

By a **3-2 vote** of the Commission (Vice Mayor Imberman and Commissioner Calderon *dissenting*), an offer of \$7,500 to Indian Creek was approved as a show of good faith in relation to the Fire Service Opt-Out Litigation.

The Commission received an update on pending projects from Calvin Giordano & Associates (CGA).

Boat storage notices were suspended until the affected residents could attend a Planning & Zoning Board meeting to discuss their ideas.

Parks & Recreation Director, Tim Milian was directed to investigate costs of “Vita Course” Beach Fitness Stations. The Parks & Recreation Committee was to review the costs and come back to the Commission with a recommendation.

During discussion of a Community Garden, the Commission decided that those individuals interested

in this venture were to present a plan to the Town Manager.

Vice Mayor Imberman praised Special Projects Coordinator, Jody Roodman for parrying down the information in the Town Gazette to the vitals. Commissioner Weinberg indicated that people like to see photos in the Gazette. Mayor Burkett added that the Gazette is fine and agreed that Jody does a great job.

Traffic Engineer, James Spinks, from Calvin, Giordano and Associates gave a brief presentation regarding speed table installation on Byron & Abbott Avenues. The Commission determined that there would be two phases to the contract and that installation would be first and then curb and guttering or landscaping would be second.

— TOWN OF SURFSIDE PROJECTS —

A PROGRESS REPORT

- **Community Center** - Bids are due on April 23rd for the Community Center concepts.
- **Beach Walk** - The County is providing weed control on the Beach Walk.
- **Emergency Management** - The 1st draft of the Emergency Management Plan is complete and has been submitted to FEMA for funding consideration.
- **Public Utilities / Engineering:** Grant applications have been made for the “GREEN” components of the Community Center and for stormwater, drinking water and sanitary sewer improvements.
- **Building Code Services** - While building permit activity has slowed everywhere, an application has been received for a new hotel on the Best Western site and it is now in staff review. Another project at 9300 Collins Avenue is also moving forward. There will be no site plan amendment but there will be a major facelift – a new 26 room boutique hotel – same footprint, same height.
- **Grant Applications** - The applications relevant to the federal stimulus package are now “loans” with a portion to be forgiven.



FDOT BEGINS LIGHTING ENHANCEMENT PROJECT

FDOT recently began a lighting enhancement project along 96th Street/Kane Concourse from West Broadview Drive to East Harbor Drive. The project is scheduled to last approximately 6 months, although bad weather or unforeseen circumstances could impact the schedule. Lane closures are expected, seven days a week, from 9:00 am - 3:30 pm. On-street parking will be restricted at various times and locations while construction is underway.

OFFICER PATRICK MCKENNA PROMOTED TO SERGEANT

At a ceremony held on March 4th, the Surfside Police Department promoted Patrick McKenna to the rank of Sergeant. Sgt. McKenna was born and raised in Boston. He completed a Bachelors Degree in Criminal Justice and is currently enrolled in a Masters Program at FIU. Patrick began his law enforcement career with the Boston PD in 1996. He was a motorman for five years and was on SWAT for five years. Sgt. McKenna joined the Surfside Police Department in May 2006. He has been a Field Training Officer and in 2007 was selected to be a K-9 handler, partnering with "Kilo". He is also the department's taser instructor.

SURFSIDE POLICE DEPARTMENT WELL REPRESENTED AT LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS (LEO) AWARDS

The LEO awards is an annual event which provides an opportunity to recognize the achievements of outstanding police officers and prosecutors from throughout Miami-Dade County. Former Surfside Police Department Crime Prevention & Training Coordinator, **Tom Lederman**, was the recipient of the LEO of the Year Support Services Award. Tom became a familiar face to Surfside residents, as he led numerous Citizen Police Academy sessions and participated in many Crime Prevention events in the community. As a retired Sergeant from Miami Beach (strategic investigations: narcotics, organized crime), Tom brought considerable expertise to the Surfside Police Department and qualified all of the officers with firearms, and initiated new instruction on rifles, bicycles, ATV's, driver improvement, criminal investigation and officer survival. He also conducted individual and roll call training on 1st line supervision, narcotics, prostitution and terrorism.

Surfside Detective **Joe Matthews** was a runner-up in the Support Services category. Joe took on the monumental

task of overseeing and implementing the lap top computer project for the department. In addition to capably handling his investigative work, Joe is also frequently called upon to lend his technical expertise to the department's administration.

With his background in technology, Detective Matthews was able to research different systems, and visit and receive recommendations from other police departments. After months of research, he made recommendations for enhancements to the security, identification and keypad system; computer aided dispatch; records management; mobile laptop system; dispatch Dictaphone; and new procedures for compiling departmental and state statistics.

With forfeiture funds, and through Detective Matthews' expertise and knowledge, the department purchased the new technology. His next step was to train the entire police department to operate the advanced equipment. Joe accomplished this tremendous task by volunteering his time and changing his schedule on a daily basis. He also conducted remedial instruction for those in need and trained "techs" for each squad.

SURFSIDE POLICE DEPARTMENT LAUNCHES ON-LINE CRIME INFORMATION SYSTEM



The Surfside Police Department has empowered the citizens they serve by providing a free on-line crime information system that allows citizens to receive automatic daily, weekly or monthly email alerts if/when crimes occur near their home. Citizens can also view reported crime activity on an easy to use map for any location within the Surfside Police Department's boundaries. The service, located at www.townofsurfsidefl.gov/police.asp, (or at www.crimereports.com), provides neighborhood crime data in near real-time and can be accessed 24/7/365. Crime incident data is updated nightly and includes: Incident type, date, location, the distance from a citizen's address, event identification, case number, and a brief crime incident description.

"Surfside Police 'CrimeReports' will prove particularly valuable to those in the community who want to stay informed and current about what is occurring in their neighborhoods and will allow residents to work with the police department to address neighborhood crime issues." said Chief David Allen.

Later in 2009, the CrimeReports program plans to introduce additional services to support community policing and neighborhood watch@ programs. Upcoming new features will include:

- Community alerts, allowing the SPD to send information alerts to specific neighborhoods
- Neighborhood Watch tools, where residents of specific neighborhoods can contribute information
- Video integration, allowing law enforcement to attach digital video to specific crimes when it is available
