Manager's Message

Yesterday I received two letters – one anonymous and one signed. Both sought to express an opinion and they could not have been further apart. The anonymous letter used humor with a scintilla of sarcasm. It called me “Sir Portliness” which reminded me of the need to lose some weight and made its point in a rather enjoyable manner. The other letter made a point as well using ethnic references that were frankly disgusting. After 40 years in this profession, I had hoped that people could disagree on issues, express their opinions in a respectful and vigorous manner and then remember that we live in a democracy and that we elect our neighbors to make decisions by majority rule.

Surfside has come a long way in the past few years. Decisions are made in the open, old issues previously swept under the rug are being brought to light and resolved, and infrastructure projects are moving forward. The Town Commission, advisory committees and the administration are working together to create a vision for the future and implement it, while a budget has been proposed that is transparent and reduces property taxes for nearly all our property owners. We live in a pluralistic society and Surfside reflects that diversity. Let's all remember that vitriol and hatred whether in hard copy, blogs or in person do not solve problems and do not reflect well on those delivering such messages.

Now that I have that off my chest, there is much to report: Our wonderful Community Center has exceeded 10,000 visitors in less than two months. We are nearly done with the construction “punch list” and will soon be reporting to the Town Commission how all matters have been resolved. Many thanks to the Town's team that made this happen. The Downtown Vision Advisory Committee met on August 22 to review proposals for wayfarer signs, parking lot capacity data and the initiation of a Business Improvement District (BID) to enhance downtown marketing. We received proposals for 10 new police cars to be leased at a 1.59 interest rate. This will allow us to replace police vehicles that are gas hogs and need constant repair with new smaller and more efficient vehicles to be delivered in September. We have also initiated construction of the Bal Harbour/Surfside

Parking Permit Program



The Surfside Police Department will be issuing 2012 Resident Parking Permits at Town Hall beginning Monday, August 22 between 9 a.m.-5 p.m. To obtain your permit, proof of residency is required. Examples include driver's license with a Surfside address, property tax bill, water bill, rental or lease agreement. You must also bring your vehicle registration or copy. There is a limit of three permits per address. There is a \$10 fee (plus tax) per permit and it will expire September 30, 2012. Please call (305) 861-4862 or 861-4863 for further information.

sewer force main on Collins Avenue with 3200 feet of 16-inch pipe being laid through an innovative process called directional boring in less than three weeks. Check out the website www.balharboursurfsideconstruction.com. In April 2012 the repaving of Collins and Harding will begin and our two main streets will have a fresh new look. We have also begun the water/ sewer/storm drainage replacement project. Check out that website as well: www.utilityupgradeproject.com and learn when the crews will be in your neighborhood. Also, please sign the permission slips to allow us on your property to tie you into the new systems at no cost. Thanks for your patience for both projects.

Remember the two budget hearings scheduled at 5:01 p.m. on September 13 and 26, as well as the budget workshop on September 1 at Town Hall at 4 p.m. The Town Commission really wants your input. Speak your mind so that this budget becomes your budget. Finally, remember to come by Town Hall to purchase your parking permits. The cost per permit is \$10 plus tax with a limit of three per residence.




