BURGLARY CRIME PROBLEM

As you are aware, we experienced ten residential burglaries from September through November. Operational, investigative, and community awareness initiatives were put in place. The proactive operational actions resulted in nine arrests and 61 suspicious person stops by Surfside and assisting police officers from other agencies. The investigative measures included crime scene examination, background checks on workers in town, locating and interviewing burglars arrested in the past, sharing of criminal intelligence with other agencies, researching pawnshops and flea markets for stolen property, meetings with confidential sources, compiling and checking vacant homes and an independent review and recommendations of each burglary case file by a veteran Surfside Reserve Officer. Our public awareness efforts were community meetings, notifications to the media, flyers distributed and posted throughout town, Code Red Alerts, crime preventions tips on flyers and Channel 77, and watch orders and security assessments for residents' homes. A thank you to all and in particular to Lt. Rory Alberto and Sergeant Patrick McKenna for leading our response to combat this crime problem and keep the community safe!
