FBI NATIONAL ACADEMY

Lieutenant Rory Alberto will be attending the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia in January and will return in April. Chiefs and Command Staff Officers from all fifty states as well as the armed forces and international police departments have been selected to attend the most prestigious law enforcement academy in the world. We wish him the best of luck! Lieutenant Richard Williams will take over Lt. Alberto's duties. Staffing, overtime, days off, notifications, control of persons, complaints, etc. must be approved through Lt. Williams. Lt. Williams will meet with the sergeants and squads as soon as possible to get up to speed.

NEW FIREARMS

We have received the new Glock pistols. The holsters and lights are expected this month. Lt. Williams will keep you up to date on the distribution and the training.

JUVENILE OFFENDERS

- Status Offenders: Status offenders are youth who are taken into custody for behaviors that an adult could not be arrested for. These include runaways, truants, curfew violators, and possession of tobacco/alcohol. These youth may not be held securely for any length of time.
- Separation: Remember that youth must be sight/sound separated from any adult offenders, inmates or trustees. This is true even if they are arrested with an adult sibling or a parent/guardian.
- Six-hour Clock: Under the JJDP Act and Florida State Statute, law enforcement agency may hold a delinquent youth securely up to six hours. The six hours begins when the youth first enters a secure area and ends the last time they are removed from the secure area. Taking a youth out of the secure area for bathroom breaks,

food, medical attention, interview, or a drive-around does not stop the clock if the youth returns to a secure area afterwards. Even if the parent/guardian is aware or is present, if the youth is in secure the clock must continue.

ACTIVE SHOOTER TRAINING

In response to the school shooting in Connecticut, Sergeant Julio Torres will coordinate an active shooter course and walk throughs at the Bay Harbor Islands K-8 School for the department. Bay Harbor Islands, Bal Harbour, and Indian Creek PDs will also participate in the training.

Officer Dianna Hernandez will participate in the Parks and Recreation Department's antibullying event on January 17, at 6:30pm in the Community Center.

We conducted our 11th Citizens Police Academy, 5th Halloween Safety Night, 4th Summer Teen Camp, 4th Island Beach Bash, and 4th Holiday Toy Drive and many other crime prevention and community events in 2012. Six Dodge Chargers and a beach Polaris were purchased. Almost 5000 traffic citations and 5000 traffic warnings and over 15,000 parking citations were issued. Officers made more than 200 arrests and 400 suspicious persons stops and investigated over 250 traffic crashes and 250 criminal cases during the year.
