UNIFORM CRIME REPORTS

The January to June 2013 UCR Statistics have been released. Surfside had a total of 69 crimes; 64 property and 5 violent crimes. January to June 2012, Surfside had a total of 82 crimes; 74 property and 8 violent crimes. January to June 2013, Surfside Officers made 89 arrests and January to June 2012, Officers made 76 arrests. Residential burglaries, auto burglaries, and bike thefts decreased from 2012 to 2013 for the same six month period.

CRIME PREVENTION INITIATIVES

The Surfside Police Department introduced a new crime prevention initiative in July. Police Officers issue 93 Vehicle Report Cards to parked cars in the residential neighborhoods. Noted on the Vehicle Report Card was a passed or failed score. 35 failed vehicles were found unlocked or with items visible inside. 58 were found secured with no visible items. The purpose of the initiative is to remind residents to secure their property and lock their cars. Most vehicle burglaries occur overnight to unlocked cars. There were two vehicle burglaries in July, one in the residential neighborhood and one in the business district. Both were unlocked and one had visible items.

In July, Surfside Police Officers also issued 50 written courtesy warnings to residents observed violating minor traffic laws in July. The purpose of this initiative is to remind residents to drive safely in Surfside. With school out, the neighborhood streets have many children, joggers, walkers, and bikers.

The Bike with the Chief Ride is August 28, 2013, at 5:00pm.

The 12th Citizens Police Academy is scheduled September 3 to November 19, 2013. Dina Goldstein will oversee the program. Officers Hernandez and McGavern have volunteered to assist. If you know of a resident or business person that is interested in attending, contact Dina.
