Surfside Celebrates 75 Years With Parade & Beach Barbecue







In addition, a Surfside Police Officer has conducted weekly presentations at assemblies at Ruth K. Broad K-8 School in Bay Harbor Islands on bullying, gang prevention and proper behavior after school at the park.

Public Works Update

- •Flower planters were installed on 15 light posts between 94th and 96th Streets on Harding Avenue. This is a project of the Beautification Committee. The purple and pink bougainvillea flowers make a significant aesthetic contribution to the Town's business district.
- •The 95th Street "Beach House" lot fence was improved by installing a colored mesh around its perimeter.
- •The 93rd Street shower on the north side of the Community Center construction site was given a thorough maintenance treatment in anticipation of increased use during the Center's construction.
- •Stormwater drain catch basins were cleaned out as part of the annual spring maintenance program.
- •All yellow sidewalk curbs indicating "No Parking" were repainted. Many parking signs were replaced and added as needed throughout the Town.
- The lifeguard stand is being painted and the windows and door will be installed in late May. Projected completion is late May-early June.
