Town Manager's Message

This Town Manager's message will be about the new Community Center and will answer the key question this month that everyone is asking: *Will we be on time?* The commitment made by the Town Commission and the Manager was that we would open for the summer. School is out at noon on June 9 and if all goes according to plan, we intend to have Surfside kids swimming in the pool very soon thereafter. This will be a "soft opening" meaning that the building and the pools functions under a light load while we test systems and procedures. Nearly every building, public or private, opens in this manner.

When you read this issue of the *Gazette,* we will have less than a week to meet the projected opening date. To say this is tight is an understatement. Let's review what it took your Town team and all the participants in the process to get this done.

The above ground construction really began in October 2010, barely seven months ago. The Town team includes Paul Gioia, Building Director, Tim Milian, Parks and Recreation Director and Bill Evans, Public Works Director. The construction team includes Chris Giordano with CGA (oversight). Coley Smith with West Construction and Alberto Lezcano with AECOM (design). As needed Courtney Jennings with Savino Miller, Design Studio (landscape design) and various subcontractors joined the team which met weekly to deal with the hundreds of issues which arise in any complex project of this nature.

We had to deal with numerous agencies along the way. Any shoreline construction requires permits from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection and the Florida Department of Natural Resources. Thanks to Celora Jackson, Wesley Cich, Fausto Gomez and Senator Gwen Margolis for helping us with this complicated process. Any construction on Collins Avenue (SR A1A) must be permitted by the FDOT. Many thanks to Gus Pego, FDOT District Engineer for helping us as well as Esther Calas, Miami Dade County Public Works Director for her help with improving pedestrian safety on Collins Avenue and Harding Avenue. Their attention to our needs for timely permits and pedestrian safety has been extraordinary. We also have to deal with permits and inspections from the Florida Department of Health for the pools and the concession stand. Thanks to Landon Lang for their efforts. We also

Organic delivers fresh and delicious organic fruits and vegetables, sourced and selected from organic local farms and delivered directly to Surfside every other week. All produce arrives fresh picked, chemical free, ready to eat and at a cost often lower than conventional produce at your grocery store.

Deliveries are divided into full and half shares. A full share contains approximately 25-30 pounds, enough for a family of 3-4 (\$50). A half share contains approximately 14-15, for 1-2 people (\$35). A share includes a variety of 7-8 vegetables and 4-5 fruits. Add on items include eggs, meats, nuts and olive oil. have to demonstrate life safety systems that meet Miami Dade County Fire Rescue requirements. FPL's Aletha Player and her team have gone the long mile to power up the building, a very complex process that is critically necessary to complete the building on time.

Finally, Surfside Building Director Paul Gioia has been extraordinary in coming up with creative ideas to meet all necessary codes while containing costs and meeting schedules. CGA, West Construction, AECOM and Barry Miller have all made Herculean efforts. We have worked seven days per week nearly 12 hours a day for months. The patience of our neighbors in the Manatee Bay, Regent Palace and Mirabella condominiums is certainly appreciated.

The Town Commission also deserves kudos for their foresight in adding the additional meeting room (1100 square feet) and in trusting their team to make the right decisions from a timing and cost standpoint by delegating their change order approval until the project is closed out later this year.

Keep your fingers crossed and say a little prayer that we are all enjoying the facility soon after school is out. There is still a lot to do. Next month's Manager's message will explain how a project like the Community Center is closed out financially and how we did on budget. It will be very tight to meet our goal of \$5 million plus some other revenues that relate to the project. In the meanwhile, enjoy this wonderful facility and as always, thank you and the Town Commission for the opportunity to manage this extraordinary community.

Resolutions:

•Approved a site plan application and a conditional use application to permit the development of a three story structured parking facility, hotel swimming pool and jacuzzi submitted by Transacta Lanai Developers, LTD on property located at 9200 Collins Avenue.

•Approved a variance for a side setback and a setback for the entire length of the pie shaped lot at 1355 Biscaya Drive

Ratified and re-appointed Special Masters

• Approved an after-the-fact easement granting FPL a ten foot easement for underground utilities to be installed in the Community Center

Voted to adopt the following ordinances on second reading:

• Amended Town Code for Regulated Uses and added a section entitled Short Term Rental of single family dwellings, two-family dwellings, multi-family dwellings and Town homes and requiring registration of short term rentals in residential neighborhoods.

Town Commission voted/concurred to:

• Voted to contribute \$500 to Wounded Warriors Family Support.

• Voted to adopt the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report for fiscal year 2009-2010.

Building Code Requires Construction Sites to be Secured During Storms

With the 2011 hurricane season approaching, developers, contractors and homeowners should note that the Florida Building Code requires that construction sites be secured if hurricane watches and/or warnings are posted for the Town of Surfside.

Florida Building Code Miami-Dade Chapter 8 Sec. 8-11 states the owner, occupant or user of a property shall take precautions for the securing of buildings and equipment if a storm is imminent. Specifically, fabric awnings and swing signs must be secured, tents taken down and stored or lashed to the ground, roofs must be inspected and all unsecured objects securely fastened or removed. All building materials must be brought indoors or secured.

Town of Surfside Building inspectors will issue written orders to be carried out before winds of hurricane velocity are anticipated.
