SeeClickFix Empowers Residents to Help Improve our Community

Right in your hand, you have the power to make Surfside a better community. Surfside's SeeClickFix is a mobile app that allows residents to use their smart phones to submit service requests to the Town. With a few clicks of their phone, Surfsiders can photograph, map and report issues that are impacting our neighborhoods.

You can either download this app to your smart phone or simply access it on the Town website, www.townofsurfsidefl.gov. This tool also provides feedback and updates between residents and the Town, ensuring that your issue is being solved.

For instance, a resident used the app to report that a paving stone at the base of the 88th Street beach shower was missing. The same day, Public Works replied that a work order had been generated to repair the shower base. The appreciative resident was notified when the base was fixed.

I encourage everyone to use this technology. SeeClickFix makes the process accessible and easy. Together we can work to enhance our neighborhoods, raise our community standards and improve the overall quality of life for Surfsiders.

SeeClickFix is geo-dynamic, which means it knows where you are reporting from and directs the information to the right department. It allows you to use descriptions, photos and videos to instantly report situations that require attention and follow-up.

Through the app, you can also communicate, comment, get updates and thank those who worked to solve the issue.

Dangerous Heartworms Can be Prevented



With the hot and rainy summer months comes one of the most devastating animal diseases of the tropics: Heartworm disease transmitted via a mosquito bite in which a microscopic worm larva is injected into the animal's bloodstream.

Indoor and outdoor pets are equally at risk. These larvae mature and find a home within the animal's lungs, blood vessels and heart. Eventually, the worms reproduce. As the quantity of worms increases, the cardiopulmonary system becomes overwhelmed, leading to severe disease and death, if untreated. Treatment is costly (averaging about \$1000 between diagnostics, medications and hospitalization) and can possibly cause severe complications. Heartworm causes lasting damage to the heart, lungs and arteries, and can affect the animal's health and quality of life. For this reason, prevention is by



far the best option. Heartworm preventives also prevent certain intestinal parasites making it a sensible choice for all pet owners.

PayByPhone Available for Surfside Parking

Construction May Impact Surfsiders

The Florida Department of Transportation reports that Surfside residents traveling through Bay Harbor Islands and the Broad Causeway may be affected by lane closures and detours because of construction on Kane Concourse and the bridge through July 2015.

On Kane Concourse, sections of curb, gutter and sidewalks will be replaced, brick pavers will be installed at intersections, there will be new signage, paving and striping. The expansion joints on the draw bridge over the intracoastal waterway are also being replaced, requiring lane closures.

SURFSIDE HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

Hurricane season is from June 1–November 30. Surfside residents should ALWAYS be prepared for any storm.

BEFORE THE STORM

Be Prepared: Purchasing supplies once a storm is threatening is expensive and strenuous. Shopping for items a little at a time before an event eliminates the stress and avoids long lines and empty shelves. Before the storm approaches make sure you have the following items:

- Food
- Water (Store enough water for drinking, bathing, cooking for all members of your family including pets)
- Health & First Aid
- Storage (Protect important documents in zip locked bags such as: birth certificates, social security cards, insurance documents, etc.)
- Cleaning & Supplies (disposable eating utensils, mosquito repellent, gloves, liquid soap)
- Tools (flashlights, batteries, pliers, hammers, goggles, dust mask, screwdrivers, etc.)
- Generator
- Battery Operated Radio
- Special Items (spare eye glasses, diapers, wipes)
- Auto fuel (Make sure your gas tank is full)
- Money ATMs will likely be down during and after a storm, make sure you have cash on hand if needed.

Important details

Pets: In addition to food, make sure pets (cats/dogs) have proper identification tags and properly working pet carriers and leashes.

Shelters: Keep maps and numbers of your nearest shelter listed in case of emergency evacuations. (If you have pets call ahead to locate shelters that allow pets).

Photos: Take pictures of your property before and after the storm for insurance purposes.

LANDSCAPE

Properly pruning trees and shrubs before a hurricane can reduce the debris that may become airborne. Proper pruning also increases the likelihood that a tree can weather a storm. Consult or hire a certified and licensed arborist prior to tree pruning. Landscapers hired to maintain residential and commercial properties must remove vegetation including grass/tree clippings.

Do not begin any pruning or cleanup activities or place trash on the curb during a Hurricane Watch or Warning.



IF A STORM IS IMMINENT

Protect the areas of your home where wind can enter. Secure indows and doors, preferably with permanent Countyapproved storm shutters. A second option is to board up windows with 5/8" plywood. The boards

should already be cut to fit and ready for installation. Note that tape **does not** prevent window damage.

Bring in lawn furniture, garbage cans, bins and other items that are not secured and could become airbourne.

If you own a boat, use double lines at the marina. If it is trailered and cannot be garaged, stake it to the ground with rope and fill the hull with water.

Monitor the storm's progress regularly. Visit www. miamidade.gov or call 311 for updates on services. Depending on conditions, bus, rail, garbage and recycling services, as well as airport and seaport operations will be affected.

If an evacution order is given, you must leave the area and move to a location outside the evacuation zone. Make sure you take your local identification, so you can return after the storm. Turn off your electricity at the main breaker. Unplug appliances.

FLOODING

The Town of Surfside is a coastal community. Storm surge and flooding is possible during a hurricane. The Town of Surfside is currently operating on a storm drain pump system, which helps clear out flood waters quicker than expected. If electricity is lost the pumps become less effective causing water to clear out at a slower gravity flow rate.

EMERGENCIES

USE PHONES ONLY FOR EMERGENCIES. Call 911 only for **life-threatening** situations. After the danger of the storm is passed, call police or utility companies immediately to report hazards such as downed power lines, broken gas or water mains, overturned gas tanks, etc. **(STAY AWAY FROM DOWNED POWER LINES)** Do not drive or walk through standing water.

Mayor Dietch's Home Goes Green with Solar Electricity

One kilowatt at a time, Surfside's Mayor Daniel Dietch and his family are doing their part to harness the sun and protect the planet.

The Dietch family recently installed a solar panel system on their roof that taps into the sun's energy and generates enough electricity to power their entire home.

How is the Dietch house powered at night or when it is cloudy? Through the use of a "net-zero" metering system, the panels export surplus electricity back to the power grid that can accessed and used when the sun is not shining. This means that on a sunny day, when the panels are creating more electricity than the home needs, the meter will spin in reverse and like an unused cell phone minutes, they can use the "bank" of extra kilowatts .

The recently completed project was coordinated through a publicprivate program called Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE), a



Make Your Home or Business More Valuable, Efficient and Safe

The PACE program is managed and funded by a private organization called Ygrene (energy backwards). Ygrene provides 100% financing to commercial and residential property owners for energy efficiency, renewable energy, and water conservation improvements. Financing is repayable over the long term through your property tax bill. Currently 20 Miami-Dade County municipalities are participating in PACE/Ygrene.

local governmental program that allows municipalities to finance private property owners for energy efficiency, renewable energy and hurricane protection improvements to their properties. Homeowners pay nothing up front and are billed annually through their property taxes over a 10-20 year period.

"We first looked at a solar panel system six years ago and the payback was nearly 50 years. Now with net metering, the payback is approximately eight years," Mayor Dietch said. "We are very excited to have used PACE and Ygrene to finance the project. They helped us with the logistics at every step in the process. We are thrilled to be able to use our best natural resource to conserve energy."

In addition to all types of solar, the range of improvements covered by the program includes impact windows and shutters, new roofs, waterheaters, pool pumps, insulation and lighting.


Follow These Sea Turtle Guidelines


If you observe an adult sea turtle or hatchling sea turtle on the beach, follow these rules and guidelines:

- It is normal for sea turtles to be crawling on the beach on summer nights. DO NOT report normal crawling or nesting (digging or laying eggs) to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWCC) unless the turtle is in a dangerous situation or has wandered off the beach.
- Stay away from crawling or nesting sea turtles. Although the urge to observe closely will be great, please resist. Nesting is a critical stage in the sea turtle's life cycle. Please leave them undisturbed.
- DO REPORT all stranded (dead or injured) turtles to the FWCC.
- NEVER handle hatchling sea turtles. If you observe hatchlings wandering away from the ocean or on the beach, call: 1-888-404-FWCC or *FWC (Mobile Phone)
