Traffic/Parking Improvement Recommendation Meeting



The Town of Surfside will host a Town-wide Traffic/ Parking Improvement Recommendation meeting for residents on

Tuesday, April 19 at 5 p.m. at Town Hall.

The meeting will include a presentation on the current traffic mitigation systems, traffic calming devices and enhanced loading zones. Recommendations will also be discussed about modified traffic patterns between Collins Avenue and Harding Avenue and expanding the use of on-street parking.

The goal is to present considerations for these topics and allow for needed feedback from the public. The meeting will start promptly at 5 p.m. and parking is available in the municipal parking lot just north of Town Hall on 93rd Street.

Sewer Line Smoke Test To Be Conducted In April

A preventive maintenance smoke test to detect leaks in the sewer system will take place in April on weekdays from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Exact dates are dependent on the weather. Door hanger notices will be put out a day or two prior to the testing and the dates will be posted on the website. During the 15 minute test, smoke derived from vegetable oil will be forced into sewer lines. The smoke is safe, odorless, leaves no residue and has no adverse effect on people, plants or animals. Workers will observe and identify where any smoke may appear. Smoke may be seen escaping from manhole covers and roof vent stacks, but smoke should not enter homes. The Town suggests you pour 2-3 gallons of water into any seldom used sink or floor drain to fill the trap and reduce the chance of any smoke entering your home. Town Commission Action at the March 8, 2016 Meeting

Voted to approve the following resolutions:

- 1. Authorizing the expenditure of funds in the amount of \$500 for a donation to the "Do the Right Thing of Miami, Inc."
- 2. Approving an after-the-fact proclamation proclaiming March 8, 2016 as "Marta Olchyk Day."
- 3. Adopting a proclamation honoring the importance of trees for the Town of Surfside's community and environment; proclaiming April 17 as "Arbor Day."
- 4. Urging the U.S. Congress to establish a fund to financially assist and support local governments, such as the Town of Surfside, Florida in developing and implementing solutions to sea level rise and related impacts.
- 5. Approving the expenditure of funds for the restructuring and repaving of the Town Hall southwest parking lot in the amount of \$30,000.

- 6. Authorizing the expenditure of funds in the amount of \$11,238.49 to contract with USSI to provide sewer smoke testing services from the Fiscal Year 2015/2016 water and sewer fund.
- 7. Approving Calvin, Giordano & Associates Work Authorization No. 96 for engineering, surveying and design services for modification to existing traffic signals; authorizing the appropriation and expenditure \$84,994.62 from the Citizens Independent Transportation Trust Fund.
- 8. Supporting the United States Coast Guard modification of the operating schedule of the 63rd Street Bridge across Indian Creek; urging the United States Coast Guard to consider modifications to the operating schedule of the 96th Street Bridge.

February Officers & Civilian of the Month

Congratulations to Officers Bobby Gabriel, Joseph Matthews, Craig Lovellette and Communications Operator Peter Filiberto for being named Officers and Civilian of the Month. A witness contacted the Surfside Police Department to report someone enter a car parked in the 100 block of 95 Street. As the witness approached, the subject fled on foot to Collins Avenue. Communications Operator Filiberto issued a detailed description and Officers Bobby Gabriel and Joseph Matthews located a man matching the description. The witness positively identified him. Officer Gabriel and Sergeant

Valino interviewed him and he admitted entering the vehicle. They also found a vehicle registration with an Aventura address in the subject's backpack. Officer Matthews contacted the Aventura Police Department and the owner of a silver Mazda was located. He stated he had visited a friend in Surfside earlier in the evening and his vehicle was burglarized but not reported. Officer Lovellette responded to Aventura to complete that report. The subject was again interviewed by Officer Lovellette and Sergeant Valino and confessed to the second auto burglary.

Do Children at Play Signs Protect our Kids?

where Children at Play signs were widely posted in residential areas, those areas showed no evidence of having reduced pedestrian crashes, vehicle speed or legal liability. Further, if the signs encourage parents to believe the children have an added degree of

Be Safe and Register Your Dog With PD



Surfside residents have an opportunity to protect their dogs by registering them with the Surfside Police Department. If a dog is lost or found, the police can identify the pet and contact the owner.

Registration forms are available in Dispatch at the Police Department. When registering, residents also have the option of receiving a free dog tag for your pet's collar. The dog tag will have the Police Department's telephone number and a registration number to identify your dog.

When registering, please provide contact information, a color picture of your dog and indicate if the canine has a chip or is tattooed. For more than one dog, complete a separate form for each pet. Miami Beach Considering Restrictions on the Opening of 63rd Bridge

In an effort to prevent rush-hour traffic jams, the U.S. Coast Guard is seeking public input on a proposal to lock down the Miami Beach 63rd Street Bridge during rush hours. Officials have suggested to lock down the bridge from 7:10 a.m. to 9:55 a.m. and from 4:05 p.m. to 6:59 p.m. Mondays through Fridays. Plus, adding specific opening times during the day anthe week before the Miami Boat show. Federal regulations require public input before considering the changes. Tree Removal and Relocation Permits

Trees offer many benefits to our community. They help increase the real estate value of a property by 15% and can help reduce air conditioning costs by up to 40%. Trees also add an important environmental value: they help improve air quality, reduce flooding and green areas enhance the beauty of our neighborhoods.

Unfortunately, the tree canopy in Miami-Dade County is well below the national average when compared to similar metropolitan areas. Because we have lost thousands of trees to hurricanes, development and diseases, such as citrus canker, it is imperative that we protect and preserve the trees in our community.

Tree removal and relocation permits are required for the removal or relocation of any tree within Miami-Dade County not specifically exempt under the Environmental Code of Miami-Dade County.

IN MEMORIAM

Nilo Alberto Aguirre

Surfside will miss active and well-known resident Nilo Alberto Aguirre, 72, who passed away in January 2016. He was a dedicated swimmer at the Aquatic Center pool and served on the Parks & Recreation Committee for two years. A native of Ecuador, Alberto was a proud veteran of Vietnam, serving as a Combat Engineer stationed in Da Nang. He was a prominent attendee of the Town's



Veterans and Memorial Day ceremonies. Alberto also volunteered with the Surfside Business Association and served as secretary.

Surfside Police Enforces Seat Belt Law

The Surfside Police Department participated in a statewide Click It or Ticket campaign March 1-14 as law enforcement agencies statewide dedicated resources to enforce seat belt laws and encourage people to wear their seat belts. A total of 242 citations in connection with the campaign were issued by Surfside officers in the two week period. An additional 98 citations were issued for violations ranging from speeding to driving with suspended license. Officers also made 24 arrests for DUI, warrants and narcotics on the traffic stops during the campaign.



Influential Former Vice Mayor Mickey Novack Dies at 97

A former Vice Mayor and member of the Planning & Zoning Board, Mickey Novack was a trail blazing Surfsider who remains the longest serving female on the Commission.

Originally from England, she spent more than a month in a bomb shelter during the "blitz" as German planes dropped bombs day and night in London.

"She gave birth to my sister in the

bomb shelter during the air raid," her son, attorney Paul Novack said. Paul would follow his mother on the Surfside Commission serving as Mayor for six terms,1992-2004. In the 1960s, the girl born in the bomb shelter become cabaret singer Carole Taran. Mickey worked alongside her husband Robert Novack at their firm, Adam Productions. The company booked acts such as Luciano Pavarotti, Aretha Franklin and Chris Rock for corporate events.



Throughout her life, Mickey volunteered for and supported many local organizations. When her sons attended Ruth K. Broad Bay Harbor Elementary in the 1960s, the school lacked air conditioning. "My mom and other moms took that as a cause and put in the first AC in the old school." her son said.

In 2008, on her 90th birthday, she received letters of congratulations from President Bill Clinton: "You've had the opportunity of living through one of the most fascinating times the world has ever known," (he wrote) and current presidential candidate Hillary Clinton.

"The fervor and ardor with which former Vice Mayor Novack devoted herself to the community and her family in conjunction with her life achievements is truly inspirational," Rep. Ileana Ros-Lehtinen said when she entered Novack's name into the Congressional Record in 2008.

"She had a lot of admirers that respected the leadership she gave to the community and the example of often being the moral compass of the town. She just had great judgment and compassion for people," said Paul Novack.

Bring Hazardous Waste To Public Works on Saturday, May 14

Bring your hazardous waste products to the Public Works Department on Saturday, May 14 from 9 a.m.–12 p.m. Hazardous materials will be collected on this day ONLY.

The following items will be accepted: anti-freeze, house-hold chemicals or fertilizers, propane tanks, paint and paint thinner, household pesticides, batteries, pool chemicals and used motor oil. **Not Accepted:** mercury thermostats/thermometers or devices/items containing mercury, medicine/pharmaceutical waste.

Make Your Home or Business More Valuable, Efficient and Safe

Surfside residents are qualified for the PACE program, which enables certain home and business upgrades that can be paid in your annual property tax bill. PACE is managed and funded by a private organization called Ygrene (energy backwards). Ygrene provides 100% financing to commercial and residential property owners for energy efficiency, renewable energy and water conservation improvements. Financing is repayable over the long term through your property tax bill. Currently 20 Miami-Dade County municipalities are participating in PACE/Ygrene.




