

20 Years of Dedication: Marisol Vargas's Remarkable Journey in Surfside



Sailing Surfside: What initially drew you to work for the Town of Surfside, and how has the community evolved over the course of your 20-year tenure?

Our Town of Surfside community has evolved tremendously from offering the best pension plan to hosting spreading kindness, creating a social media portal, creating a safer neighborhood, a beautiful beach path and street ends, events for neighbors, a new community center, sand renourishment, a dog park, a complete remodel of our Building Department/Front lobby, established several new department & committees to have a better functionality to serve our Town Residents efficiently.

SS: As someone who has likely seen a lot of changes and challenges in your role, what do you consider to be one of the biggest accomplishments or achievements during your time at the Town of Surfside?

MV: In the Town of Surfside, I have seen lots of changes. I worked with 10 Town Managers and 10 Town Commissions. My biggest accomplished while working full-time has been obtaining my Master of Public Administration, my BAS Supervision and Management with a concentration in Finance & C.C.C. SS: What motivated you to remain in the Town of Surfside for 20 years, and what factors have contributed to your longevity here?




