

Florida Friendly Landscaping (FFL)

Florida-Friendly Landscaping[™] (FFL) means using low-maintenance plants and environmentally sustainable practices. Learn how you can have a beautiful landscape that could save you time, energy and money while protecting our future. See the <u>Florida Friendly Landscaping[™] program</u> website for training, contact information and more information about the program. FFL includes locally native plants and compatible non-native plants.

Town of Surfside Code requires a portion of your landscaped area at your home to be Florida Friendly Landscaping. This is a way for Surfside to promote sustainable land use practices to contribute to a healthy Florida!

Town Code:

- Town of Surfside Ordinance No. 22-1729 requires at least 40% of pervious areas (landscaping) to be a Florida Friendly Landscape and 40% of all required trees and shrubs to be an FFL defined species, for all new single family and duplex dwelling.
- 40% of the pervious area of multifamily dwellings must be Florida Friendly Landscaping.
- 50% of the pervious area of all other development uses must be Florida Friendly landscaping.

Benefits of a Florida-Friendly Landscape A Florida-friendly landscape can be designed to look the way you want, fit the aesthetics of Surfside, and suit your lifestyle, while being environmentally sustainable.

- Reduced use of water, fertilizer, and pesticides, which saves money
- Properly selected and maintained plants thrive
- Provides habitats for birds, butterflies, and other wildlife
- Helps keep nutrient pollution out of our water
- Can be designed for low maintenance
- Aesthetically pleasing while protecting the environment
