OFFICER OF THE MONTH – JUNE 2013

On Sunday, June 30, 2013 at 1047 hours the Surfside Police Department received 911 call of a fight between two males in the 8800 Block of Dickens Avenue. Officer Diana Hernandez was dispatched as the primary officer and Officer Donald McGavern as the backup officer. Upon arrival at the scene, Officer Hernandez and Officer McGavern found two landscapers who had been engaged in the physical altercation. One victim was in distress and unresponsive due to his injuries. Officer McGavern and Officer Hernandez immediately began CPR on the victim and continued cycles of breathe and compressions until Miami- Dade Fire Rescue arrived. The victim was transported to Jackson Memorial Hospital by Miami- Dade Fire Rescue and later expired.

Officer McGavern and Officer Hernandez were brought to exhaustion from their relentless efforts of administering CPR to the victim. Officer McGavern and Officer Hernandez maintained their composure and professionalism throughout this high stress incident. Officer McGavern's and Officer Hernandez's training, interpersonal communication skills and above all else their "compassion and commitment" to our community are commendable. Their actions provided the highest level of police service possible.

CRIME PREVENTION/ COMMUNITY EVENTS

The Surfside Police Department will introduce a new crime prevention initiative in July. Police Officers will issue Vehicle Report Cards to parked cars in the residential neighborhoods. Noted on the Vehicle Report Card will be a passed or failed score. Failed vehicles were found unlocked or with items visible inside. The purpose of the initiative is to remind residents to secure their property and lock their cars. Most vehicle burglaries occur overnight to unlocked cars.

In July, Surfside Police Officers will also issue written courtesy warnings to residents observed violating minor traffic laws in July. This is a warning only and not a citation and will not affect the driving record. The purpose of this initiative is to remind residents to drive safely in Surfside. With school out, the neighborhood streets have many children, joggers, walkers, and bikers.

The Summer Police Teen Camp is up and running. The teens have been instructed on Patrol Procedures and Crime Scene Investigations and visited the Fire Rescue Station.
