## **BUSINESS DISTRICT OFFICER**

The Business District Officer is a new program that will be implemented on October 10<sup>th</sup>. The officer will work Tuesday through Friday from 12:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. This assignment is designed to incorporate a consistent police presence in the Business District during the busiest hours. The business owners and regular visitors to the area will develop a relationship with the Business District Officer and further enhance the SPD Community Policing philosophy and practices. Officer Alejandro Lorente is the new business district officer.

## **HIGH HOLIDAY DETAIL**

The High Holiday services began on Sunday evening, October 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2016, and end late Tuesday, October 25<sup>th</sup>, 2016.

The Surfside Police Department has increased police presence with assigned details for high visibility during the High Holidays in the areas of The Shul 9540 Collins Avenue, Young Israel 9592 Harding Avenue, Hechal Shalom Sephardic Congregation 310 95th Street and Magen David Sephardic Congregation 9348 Harding Avenue. The enhanced patrols will be concentrated before and after services when congregants from the surrounding area and neighboring communities are walking to and from these locations. In addition, Bal Harbour and Bay Harbor Islands Police Departments will assign officers to further augment patrols in the area.

The following actions in accordance with the below schedule have been instituted:

- Assign specific officers to directed patrols with the overhead riding lights on in the residential and high pedestrian areas, focusing on congregants walking to and from local synagogues.
- Assign specific officers to bicycle & Segway patrols in and around the Business District, Collins Avenue and the 96 Street corridor where there is heavy pedestrian travel (rotate as necessary).
- As the shift supervisor, you visit the high risk locations (The Shul, Young Israel), check on their status and make them aware that we are proactively patrolling the areas.
- Have all available units maintain high visibility throughout their shifts, use riding lights in the residential areas for enhanced visibility.

**SECURITY CAMERA MONITORS AT TOWN HALL SOUTH EXIT POINTS**
