SIGNIFICANT INVESTIGATIONS/INCIDENTS

Residential Burglary 06/22/2021 at 1156 hours 8900 block of Abbott Avenue Unknown subject(s) entered an unlocked backyard shed between 06/20/2021-06/22/2021 taking a bicycle valued at \$1,500.00 dollars. The home's surveillance cameras were reviewed by a detective however it did not capture the incident.



Partial Building Collapse 06/24/2021 at 0120 hours

8777 Collins Avenue – Champlain Tower South

Officers responded to a call of a fire alarm and encountered a partially collapsed condominium building. The building was occupied and multiple victims were expected. Miami-Dade Fire Rescue arrived on scene and began treating injured people and conducting search and rescue operations. The remainder of the condominium was evacuated and residents were escorted to the Surfside Community Center which later become the Family Reunification Center. The scene was secured and a perimeter was established. A Unified Command Post was established at 87th Terrace and Collins Avenue and a media staging area was established at 84th Street and Collins Avenue. Traffic was diverted away from the scene on Collins and Harding Avenues. Miami-Dade Police Department Homicide Unit was contacted and took over the scene. Multiple police agencies and fire rescue departments also responded to offer assistance. The Town of Surfside issued a Local State of Emergency. Miami-Dade County Mayor issued a Declaration of Local State of Emergency and the Florida Governor issued a State of Emergency in Miami-Dade County. Officers have been assigned to multiple traffic posts throughout the Town in an effort to control pedestrian and vehicular traffic. This incident is still active and ongoing.

Concealed Weapon Arrest 06/30/2021 at 1230 hours

8800 block of Carlyle Avenue

While on a traffic post, officers conducted a traffic stop noticing a firearm inside the vehicle. A record check revealed that the driver did not have a conceal weapons permit. A small amount of marijuana was found in the driver's pocket. The marijuana and firearm were impounded. The driver was arrested.
