OFFICERS OF THE MONTH - AUGUST 2021 - OFFICER RONALD DONOSO AND OFFICER JUAN DURAN

On August 2, 2021 at 7:06 p.m., Surfside Police Department units were dispatched to the 9300 block of Abbott Avenue in reference to a residential fire. Upon arrival, units observed heavy smoke coming from the interior of the home. Several family members were outside of the home however, their elderly/disabled grandmother was still in the home in her bedroom. Officer Ronald Donoso, Officer John Gentile and Officer Dianna Hernandez were led to the north west corner of the home and shown the nearest window to where the fire was emanating. These officers then utilized their department issued fire extinguishers to combat the fire. Soon after, Officers Donoso and Duran entered the home locating the female in the south east bedroom with the assistance of a family member. Officer Donoso and Officer Duran carried the female out of the home, utilizing a blanket as a gurney. MDFD Engine 76, under the command of Lt. Diaz, treated and released the elderly female on scene. The cause of the fire was an overheated lithium scooter battery which was located in the bedroom. Thankfully, there were no serious injuries. The fire caused approximately \$5,000, worth of damage to the residence. The home was deemed safe by both MDFD and FPL. The family temporarily relocated to a friend's home.

Officer Ronald Donoso and Officer Juan Duran are commended for their quick thinking and swift actions resulting in the rescue of a disabled female. The admirable qualities these officers possess are indicative of the caliber, bravery, dedication and training of the Surfside Police Department personnel. Congratulations Ronald and Juan on this well-deserved honor!!!

SIGNIFICANT INVESTIGATIONS/INCIDENTS

Residential Fire 08/02/2021 at 1906 hours 9300 block of Abbott Avenue

Officers responded to a call of a residential fire. The officers saw heavy smoke emitting from the interior of the home. Most of the occupants had already safely evacuated, however, an elderly disabled female still remained in a rear bedroom of the house. Officers utilized their fire extinguishers to put out the fire and then entered the home. Officers were able to safely extract the elderly female out of the home, by utilizing a blanket as a gurney. Miami-Dade Fire Rescue responded, treated, and released the elderly female on scene. They also aired out the home and deemed the home safe to occupy. FPL responded determining it was not necessary to shut off the electrical power to the home. The cause of the fire was determined to be an overheated lithium scooter battery. The home sustained an estimated \$5,000.00 dollars' worth of damages.

Auto Burglary 08/12/2021 at 1230 hours 100 block of 88th Street

On 06/24/2021, at approximately 0105 hours, the victim parked his locked vehicle near the Champlain Towers South collapse. The vehicle in turn was damaged due to the collapse and therefore towed. On 06/28/2021, the victim went to the tow yard to retrieve his vehicle noticing the right windows of the vehicle were broken. A total of \$3,605.00 dollars' worth of property were taken including \$2,025.00 in cash, a Samsung tablet, a Motorola cellular phone, and other miscellaneous items

D.U.I./Hit & Run/Possession of Controlled Substance Arrest 08/12/2021 at 1533 hours 9500 block of Harding Avenue

A B.O.L.O. was transmitted over the police radio reference a van involved in a hit and run in North Miami, Bay Harbor Islands, and Surfside. A Surfside officer observed the van and conducted a traffic stop. It was determined the driver was driving under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs. A breathalyzer test revealed the driver was over the legal limit. A search of the vehicle revealed and a Xanax pill and one pill of a controlled substance (Alprazolam). The driver was arrested.

Unoccupied Residential Burglary 08/15/2021 at 2203 hours 8800 block of Abbott Avenue

Officers responded to a call of a burglary in progress. The homeowners, who were out of town, observed a male inside their house through their surveillance cameras. A perimeter was established around the home and it was thoroughly searched with the assistance of Miami Beach Police Department K-9 units. However, the male was not located. Several bottles of liquor were located by the rear of the residence. It is unknown at this time if any items are missing since the homeowners were not present. Crime scene responded and processed the scene for evidence.



Auto Burglary 08/16/2021 at 1837 hours 9000 block of Abbott Avenue

On 08/14/2021, at approximately 0250 hours, a male subject was captured on surveillance camera entering an unlocked vehicle parked at a residence in the 9000 block of block of Abbott Avenue, however nothing was missing. Another unlocked vehicle was entered within the same time-frame, at another residence in the 9000 block of Abbott Avenue. It is believed the same male subject committed both burglaries. Two children's life jackets (\$60.00-dollar total value) were taken from the second vehicle.

Stolen Vehicle 08/21/2021 at 0824 hours 8800 block of Hawthorne Avenue

A vehicle was parked on the south side of the driveway of a residence on 08/20/2021 at 8:30 p.m. On 8/21/2021, at 8:15 a.m., the vehicle was discovered missing from the driveway. The repo log was checked, an area canvas was completed and a BOLO was issued via Miami Dade County dispatch.

More than 220 law enforcement officers in the United States have died in the line of duty, including over 115 officers who succumbed as a result of COVID-19.

In addition, Bal Harbour and Bay Harbor Islands Police Departments will assign officers to further augment patrols in the area. There will be uniformed security guards working throughout the holidays at the Shul and Young Israel.
