#### SIGNIFICANT INVESTIGATIONS/INCIDENTS

Unknown subject(s) entered an unlocked vehicle stealing a phone charger. Surveillance cameras captured a subject exiting a white pick-up truck and entering the victim's vehicle.

Unknown subject(s) broke the lock of a vehicle while it was parked in the municipal lot. The victim did not realize she had been burglarized until she received a fraud related call from her bank. The victim's purse was left inside the vehicle in plain view, 15 credit cards and \$800.00 dollars in U.S. Currency were missing from her wallet.

Officers responded to a call of a house on fire. Upon their arrival, the house was fully engulfed in flames. The occupants of the house which were two adult brothers were outside and unharmed. For the safety of the community, the surrounding roadways were temporarily closed and surrounding homes were evacuated. Miami-Dade Fire Rescue responded and extinguished the fire. This case is currently being investigated by the Miami-Dade Police Department's Arson Squad.
