OFFICER OF THE MONTH - JULY 2023 - OFFICER BOBBY GABRIEL AND OFFICER JOSHUA ROSARIO

On Sunday, July 23, 2023, the North Bay Village Police Department requested additional support from police units from neighboring police agencies regarding a vehicle that had fled from police officers. During the chase, two subjects bailed out of the vehicle that had overturned and was now on fire. Officer Bobby Gabriel and Officer Joshua Rosario immediately responded to the John F. Kennedy Causeway to assist with the search. As Officer Gabriel and Officer Rosario conducted a search in a dark lit area near the water in view of the waterline, they discovered a male attempting to conceal himself in the water from police apprehension. Officer Gabriel gave verbal commands for the subject to come out of the water and advised the North Bay Village Police the subject had been located. The subject was placed into custody without further incident.

Officer Gabriel and Officer Rosario are commended for their professionalism, courage, and dedication to law enforcement. These distinguished officers responded to an extremely challenging and highly volatile situation exhibiting an elevated level of alertness and bravery. The remarkable police instincts ingrained in Officer Gabriel and Officer Rosario were demonstrated during this critical incident. SIGNIFICANT INVESTIGATIONS/INCIDENTS

Update: Burglary Arrest

07/02/2023

9200 block of Harding Avenue

On June 29, 2023, CCTV footage shows three males walking into the front yard of a residence. One of the males enters the backyard through an unlocked gate and takes a bicycle. On June 30, 2023, the subjects are seen casing the home again, however when a family member walked outside the subjects fled. Detectives identified and arrested the subjects as part of a joint operation with the Miami Beach Police Department's Burglary Unit. The subjects were also charged with various burglary and theft charges reference three additional Surfside PD cases.



Aggravated Assault Arrest 07/02/2023 9100 block of Collins Avenue

An officer observed two males on the sidewalk that appeared to be arguing. The victim (a security guard) was observed walking backwards and the subject was charging aggressively towards him. Upon observation, the officer immediately approached the males. The victim advised he found the subject sleeping on the sidewalk in front of 9111 Collins Avenue. The security guard approached the subject who became very aggressive when he took out a folding knife and starting charging towards the victim. A recording of the incident showed the subject advancing towards the victim with a sharp object in his left hand. A search of the subject revealed a folding knife in his left shorts pocket. The subject was subsequently arrested.

A male was observed by the homeowner walking onto his property attempting to take his bicycle. The victim confronted the subject and he proceeded to leave without resistance. Detectives identified and arrested the subject as part of a joint operation with the Miami Beach Police Department's Burglary Unit. Update: Burglary Arrest

07/05/2023

9300 block of Abbott Avenue

An unlocked scooter located near the front door of a residence was stolen. There was no CCTV footage of the incident however this occurred during the same time frame as an attempted bicycle theft. Detectives identified and arrested the subjects as part of a joint operation with the Miami Beach Police Department's Burglary Unit. Attempted Burglary 07/13/2023 9400 block of Collins Avenue

A security guard witnessed three males get out of a white vehicle and attempt to open the doors of three vehicles at the 100 block of 95th Street. Due to weather conditions, finger prints were unable to be lifted off the vehicles. CCTV footage captured the incident and no entry was made into the vehicles.

An unlocked vehicle with the keys located inside was stolen from the driveway of a residence. Review of CCTV footage revealed three males walking up the driveway at approximately 0311 hours. One of the males was observed gaining entry into the vehicle and driving off in the stolen SUV. The stolen vehicle was located in Fort Lauderdale and recovered.
