Sign Up to Receive Emergency and Traffic Notifications

Residents can sign up to receive CodeRED emergency alert messages issued by the Surfside Police Department. The system enables the Police Department to deliver emergency notifications and/or informational messages, including evacuation notices, missing child alerts, boil water notices, fire/flood disasters, health related notices and traffic advisories.

The notifications and advisories are sent out as voice messages and text messages to registered telephone, cellphone and email addresses of Town residents and businesses. Residents can register by accessing the Town website, www.townofsurfsidefl.gov, type in "Code Red" in the search bar and the first entry will display the link to

register for the CodeRED System. There is also a CodeRED app available for your cell phone and you may register via the app. "The CodeRED system is only as good as the database supporting it. If your phone number or email is not in the database it will not be called. In an emergency situation, early notification can help save lives," said Surfside Police Chief David Allen. CodeRED provides greater protection during critical situations and reduces the demand on emergency personnel so they may better focus and manage their response efforts.
