Owners Must Leash and Pick-up after Dogs

The Town of Surfside enforces unleashed dog violations. According to section 10-28(c) of the Town Code, the daily civil fine for a first offense is \$50 and a daily fine second/repeat offense is \$100. Please leash your pet!
