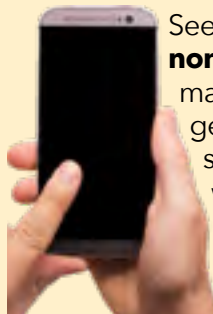
Register for CodeRed Today
