Register Your Dog With the Surfside Police Department



Is your family dog registered with the Surfside Police Department? A community program for residents offers a free tag to attach to the collar of your pet dog. The tag will have the Police Department's telephone and a registration number. This service is free of charge.

If the dog is found, the owners can be quickly located through the registration information kept at the Police Department. The dog and owner can be reunited without having to contact Miami-Dade Animal Control. Please note that this tag does not replace the Miami-Dade County dog tag.
