11 12	WHEREAS, the Town of Surfside ("Town") is committed to the health and safety of its residents, businesses, and visitors; and
13 14	WHEREAS, Chapter 14 of the Town's Code of Ordinances ("Code") pertains to buildings and building regulations; and
15 16	WHEREAS, storm shutters and hurricane protection devices provide important protection from the potentially disastrous effects of weather events; and
17 18 19 20	WHEREAS, the use of storm shutters and hurricane protection devices in times when there is not an impending storm or hurricane diminish the aesthetics of the Town's residential and commercial areas, have a detrimental effect on the Town's economy, and can create unnecessary safety risks; and
21 22 23	WHEREAS, the Town Commission finds that regulations should be adopted to prohibit use of these devices when severe weather events, such as tropical storms or hurricanes, are not present or looming; and
24 25	WHEREAS, the Town Commission wishes to amend Chapter 14 of the Town's Code to create Section 14-58 to regulate the use of storm shutters and hurricane protection devices; and
26 27	<b>WHEREAS</b> , the Town Commission finds that this Ordinance is necessary for the public health, safety and welfare of the Town.
28 29	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE TOWN OF SURFSIDE AS FOLLOWS: $^{\rm 1}$
30	Section 1. Recitals. The above-stated recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.

Town Code Amended. The Code of Ordinances of the Town of Surfside, 32 Section 2. Florida is hereby amended by amending by creating a new Section 14-58, which section reads as 33 34 follows: 35 Chapter 14 – Buildings and Building Regulations \*\*\* 36 Article III. - Property Maintenance Standards 37 \*\*\* 38 39 Section 14-58. Storm Shutters and Hurricane Protection Devices. (a) During the period from December 1 to May 31, no storm shutters or hurricane protection 40 devices on any non-residential structures certified for occupancy shall remain in a 41 closed/secured or partially closed/secure position so as to block or cover windows, openings, 42 or doors except in the event of severe weather conditions as announced by a watch or warning 43 issued by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) or any of its offices 44 or successor entities for any portion of the Town. In the event of such severe weather 45 conditions as announced by a watch or warning issued by NOAA or any of its offices or 46 successor entities, storm shutters or hurricane protection devices may be used to protect non-47 48 residential building/structure openings. Storm shutters or hurricane protection devices must be removed within seven days following either the storm or hurricane's passage or the 49 50 termination of a declared state of emergency by the Town, whichever occurs later. (b) During the period of June 1 to November 30, protection from windborne debris through the 51 use of storm shutters and hurricane protection devices is encouraged for all non-residential 52 structures certified for occupancy in the Town. During this period, in the event that the upon 53 NOAA National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration or any of its offices or successor 54 entities issuing a watch or warning for a named tropical storm or hurricane for any 55 portion of the Town, storm shutters or hurricane protection devices may be used to protect 56 non-residential building/structure openings, up to ten days prior to storm landfall and Storm 57 shutters or hurricane protection devices must be removed within seven days may remain in 58 59 place for no more than ten days following either the storm or hurricane's passage or the termination of a declared state of emergency by the Town, whichever occurs later. 60 Secs. 14-589 - 14-75. - Reserved. 61 \*\*\* 62 Codification. It is the intent of the Town Commission that the provisions Section 3. 63 of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Town's Code of Ordinances, and that the 64 sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered, and the word "ordinance" may be 65 changed to "section," "article," "regulation," or such other appropriate word or phrase in order to 66 accomplish such intentions. 67 68 Section 4. **Severability.** The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable
