ORDINANCE NO. 2023 - 1762

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN COMMISSION OF THE TOWN OF SURFSIDE, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES BY CREATING CHAPTER 73, "CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS DEPARTMENT", PROVIDING FOR A DEFINITION OF TOWN "CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT"; PROVIDING FOR FUNCTIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT, PLANNING, BUDGETING AND IMPLEMENTATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, CONFLICTS, CODIFICATION AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 17 of the Charter provides that the Town of Surfside ("Town") Commission may create new departments by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Town Commission desires to create and include in the Town's Code of Ordinances (the "Code"), as Chapter 73 "Capital Improvement Projects Department" ("Department"), and provide for definitions, the functions of the Department, budgeting and implementation Town capital improvement projects; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Town to proactively enhance its infrastructure development, and overall community well-being, through effective management and execution of capital improvement projects; and

WHEREAS, the Town acknowledges the integral role that public capital improvements play in shaping the Town's growth and prosperity, recognizing that these initiatives constitute a significant portion of all public expenditures within the Town's iurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Town aspires to establish a comprehensive and strategic approach to the planning, budgeting, and implementation of various capital improvement projects, with the Department under the oversight of the Town Manager and/or a newly appointed designee or director; and

WHEREAS, the Town Commission finds that this Ordinance is in the best interest and welfare of the Town.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COMMISSION OF THE TOWN OF SURFSIDE, FLORIDA AS FOLLOWS¹:

26 27 28 29	<u>Section 2.</u> <u>Town Code Adopted.</u> Chapter 73 of the Town Code "Capital Improvements Projects Department" is hereby created to read as follows:		
30	CHAPTER 73. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS DEPARTMENT.		
31	<u>Sec. 73-1. Purpose.</u>		
32 33 34 35 36	The Town of Surfside recognizes that the progress and direction of community development are intricately linked to public capital improvements. These improvements represent a significant portion of the Town's expenditures, underscoring the need for strategic planning. The Town wishes to provide for the efficient preparation, budgeting, and integration of numerous public capital projects within a comprehensive program.		
37	Sec. 73-2. Creation of a Capital Improvement Projects Department; Functions.		
38 39 40 41	The Capital Improvement Projects Department is hereby established, under the supervision and coordination of the Town Manager and/or director appointed by the Town Manager, to implement and manage capital improvement projects. The functions of the Department shall include, but not be limited to:		
42 43	 a) Administration and management of capital improvement and infrastructure projects for the Town; 		
44 45	(b) Identification of capital improvement and infrastructure projects and equipment purchases for the Town;		
46	(c) Propose and implement capital improvement plan(s);		
47 48 49	(d) Planning and implementation schedule for such projects, including a timetable for construction and completion of projects, under the direction of the Town Manager and/or director;		
50 51 52	(e) Forecasting or planning for future development and growth within the Town, including facilities, utilities, infrastructure and equipment programs for implementation of the plans;		
53	(f) Solicitation, compilation and evaluation of new projects requests;		
54	(g) Evaluation of previously approved, unimplemented or incomplete projects;		
55	(h) Prioritization of projects;		
56	(i) Assist with the development of financing plans or options for the projects; and		
57	(i) Monitoring and management of existing projects.		

58 Sec. 73-3. Definitions.

- As used in this Chapter 73, the following terms shall have the following meanings:
 - (a) Capital Improvement Project(s). "Capital Improvement Project(s)" means a planned undertaking of the Town that leads to the acquisition, construction, or extension of the useful life of capital assets. Capital assets include things such as land, buildings, parks, streets, utilities, and other items of value from which the community derives benefit. To constitute a capital improvement project, the project must:
 - 1. Have a useful life of more than ten years.
 - 2. Be a one-time outlay, which is non-recurring in nature.
 - 3. Add to, enhance the value of, or extend the life of the Town's physical assets.
 - 4. Major equipment purchases must be associated with a Capital Improvement Project and must meet the criteria in item 1 above in order to be included as a Capital Improvement Project.
 - Any project which meets the definition of a Capital Improvement Project must be included in the Capital Improvement Plan, regardless of funding source.
 - 5. Excluded from the definition of Capital Improvement Projects are:
 - i. Town vehicular equipment purchases. Fleet appropriations are to be considered within the operating budget.
 - ii. Expenditures for repair, maintenance, supplies and materials or replacement items which shall be budgeted as operating items.
 - (b) Capital Improvement Plan. The Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) is a comprehensive five-year plan of proposed capital improvement projects, updated annually, intended to identify and balance the capital needs of the community within the fiscal capabilities and limitations of the Town budget.
 - (c) Capital Improvement Plan Budget. Capital Improvement Plan Budget shall be submitted annually with the Town Annual Budget and is the first year of the Capital Improvement Plan.

Sec. 73-4. Capital Improvement Plan and Capital Improvement Plan Budget; Contents.

(a) Capital Improvement Plan. The overall Capital Improvement Plan is formulated to reflect Town's capital priorities and needs for the ensuing five-year period. The Capital Improvement Plan shall include a brief summary of each project with sufficient detail to define the basic scope of the project and show the proposed level of funding and the timing thereof for the various stages of each project, including the date of inception of the project. Each project shall include the projected comprehensive budget necessary to complete the project in its entirety, all prior funds appropriated by the Town or otherwise received for or contributed to

- the project and anticipated funding by source from all anticipated sources on a project-by-project basis. For each project included in the CIP, the funding source and amount of funding for the anticipated post-construction operation costs shall also be included. Years two through five of the plan may be subject to change as emergencies arise or projects are delayed by circumstances beyond the Town's control, including removal of projects from the CIP or delayed from the CIP or the scope or budget of such project substantially changed. The annual focus primarily will be on the fifth year of the plan as new projects are added.
- (b) Capital Improvement Plan Budget. The Capital Improvement Plan Budget is the first year of the Capital Improvement Plan. The Capital Improvement Plan Budget shall be adopted annually as a separate budget or a separate section within the annual budget to be known as the "Capital Improvement Plan Budget" separate and apart from the operating budget of the Town or any other budget required by law.

Sec. 73-5. Preparation and submission of the Capital Improvement Plan Budget.

On or before July 1 of each year, the Capital Improvement Projects Department shall meet with all departments of the Town to develop a proposed Capital Improvements Plan Budget for the succeeding fiscal year. The Town Manager shall submit the proposed Capital Improvements Plan Budget to the Town Commission in conjunction with the submission of the annual budget.

Sec. 73-6. Progress and Closure of Capital Improvement Projects.

Progress of Capital Improvement Projects is to be tracked by the Town Manager's and/or Department Director. The Town Manager may hire a Director to assist in the implementation and oversight of the Department.

<u>Section 3.</u> <u>Severability.</u> If any section, part of section, paragraph, clause, phrase or word of this Ordinance is declared invalid, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall not be affected.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Conflicts.</u> To the extent that this Ordinance conflicts wholly or partially with any existing provision in the Town Code, the terms of this Ordinance shall prevail.

<u>Section 5.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon adoption.
