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On 05/09/2025 at approximately 0910 hours, while patrolling the 8800 block of Harding Avenue, an officer observed a 2004 Nissan Sentra traveling southbound. A records check revealed that the registered owner had a suspended driver's license. The officer noted that the driver matched the photograph on file for the registered owner.

After conducting a traffic stop, the officer made contact with the driver, who claimed to be the registered owner's brother and stated that his own driver's license was also not valid. A records check confirmed that the driver had an active warrant for Driving While License Suspended.

The driver was placed under arrest and transported to TGK without incident.

On Friday, May 9th at approximately 0845 hours, a sergeant was conducting a traffic enforcement detail in the 9100 block of Collins Avenue when a vehicle was observed traveling with non-functional brake lights and illegal window tints. A traffic stop was conducted, and a records check revealed an active child support warrant for the driver.				
The driver verbally identified himself and was also positively identified through law enforcement databases. He was taken into custody and transported to Miami-Dade Warrants and then to TGK for further processing.				

05/10/2025	Suspicious Incident	96 Street Collins Ave		
We received a call reporting a tall white male, dressed in all black clothing, seen walking near the				
synagogue while shouting antisemitic remarks and threatening to blow up the premises. The threats				
were not directed at anyone in particular. The suspect is believed to be possibly mentally disturbed.				
Upon our arrival, the individual was gone on arrival. The report was initially made by an unidentified				
passerby, who informed synagogue security personnel before leaving the area. Security personnel				
then relayed the information to us. There is no available surveillance footage from the synagogue				
related to the incident.				

05/10/2025	Incident	8911 Collins Ave
On 05/09/2025, a complainant, who is a licensed therapist, reported to police that a housekeeper		

overheard a male individual stating his intent to kill his soon-to-be ex-wife and children. The therapist further advised that the individual possessed firearms at his residence.

Upon arrival, responding units attempted to make contact with the individual at the reported location. The male refused to open the door initially. Officers maintained communication with him and his current girlfriend via cellphone. After continued dialogue, the male eventually opened the door and complied with police instructions.

Further investigation revealed that the male in question is not a patient of the therapist. It was determined that the therapist currently treats the male's ex-wife, and the male has been experiencing ongoing personal and legal issues with her. During the time officers were on scene, the housekeeper was also texting the male regarding unpaid wages for cleaning his daughter's house.
