## Town Manager's Message

As my retirement in April fast approaches, a number of responsibilities weigh on me. The most important is to help the Town Commission find my successor. We have received 805 applications after wide advertising. Through consensus and a first level (more to follow) background check, our Human Resources Director and I have reduced that huge response to 13 applicants. By the time you receive this *Gazette* in the mail, the initial short list will be public and the Town Commission will let us know if they are satisfied with the list. If so, interviews have been scheduled for February 26, 2013 and then the Town Commission will rank the applicants. Contract negotiations will then begin with an employment agreement to be reviewed most likely during the March 12, 2013 Town Commission meeting. If all goes as planned, there will be nearly a month when the new Town Manager and I can work together to ensure an orderly transition. The title "Mr. or Ms. Manager" imposes a great responsibility and the new Town Manager should provide all the complex skill sets that are necessary to succeed.

**The job description appears on pages 7 and 8 of this issue of the Gazette.** Please read it and let your Commissioners know if you think the candidates match up. Also weighing on me is completing a long list of projects reported to the Town Commission every month in the Points of Light agenda item. These projects average 40-45 monthly and become Points of Light by individual or collective Town Commission action, the initiative of the Town Manager or requested by citizens during the Good and Welfare portion of the agenda. It also weighs heavily on me that not all projects will be completed, however, the Town Commission has selected projects which they want to see moved along to the maximum feasible extent. Our wonderful Town Staff is fully engaged in delivering that list.

Another tough challenge is to ensure that the Town Staff does not fear for their careers because a new Manager is coming on board. Many Staff members told me that there was fear when I was hired because of my reputation of being a tough guy who bodes no foolishness. You have my full confession on this matter. Perhaps my epitaph will say, "He was tough, but he was fair". Under our Town Charter, the new Manager will have the sole responsibility of evaluating the Staff. My only counsel to our team is that first impressions matter greatly and perform to your best ability. That is all that can be asked.

Finally in the words of one of my mentors, Colonel Mitchell Wolfson, "Never take from a community more than you are willing to give." As Mayor Dietch emphasizes

## Barbara & Louis Cohen Believe in Giving Back to their Community

Whether it is a Surfside community event, a committee or Commission meeting or any Town function, most likely in attendance will be Barbara and Louis Cohen. To say they are active Surfside volunteers is an understatement. The 20-year residents are dedicated to supporting Surfside, which they call "a gem of a community ... a truly wonderful place to live."

Married nearly 25 years and friends for over 60 years, Barbara and Louis spent the first half of their lives in upstate New York. Louis was a private psychologist who also was Bureau Chief in charge of Research and Evaluation for the New York State Department of Education. In 1965, he received a major grant to establish data collection centers that were the forerunners of today's electronic data retrieval systems. Barbara was a widow at the time and began working for Louis and was instrumental in the start of the data information system.

Louis left the education system in the 1980s and became very successful in real estate. His wife, Elaine, passed away in 1985. He and Barbara had remained friends through the years and married in 1988.

Both had ties with Surfside and they purchased a



condominium in 1991. They became full time residents in 1994.

"We never regretted the move and fell in love with the community," said Barbara. She became involved with several organizations and is now the Vice Chair of the Citizen's Coalition of the Miami Dade Public Schools and

President of the Northshore Democratic Club. Barbara was encouraged by Surfside elected officials to become active in the community and now serves as the Vice Chair of the Tourist Board. Louis was tired of waiting for her at home, so he joins her at Town events.

Between them, they have five grown children and 11 grandchildren.

"We believe in being involved and giving back to our community," said Barbara.

# Job Description for Town Manager of the Town of Surfside

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Highly responsible administrative, professional and management work directing and coordinating all phases of the general municipal government. Work involves the supervision of all activities related to the Town in accordance with the policies determined by the Town Commission, Town Charter, and applicable laws and ordinances.

## ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS

1. Directs and manages the overall effort of the Town government. Appoints department heads and acts as appointing authority for Town employees. Coordinates the efforts of the various departments under the Town governmental structure.
2. Administers through subordinate department heads such functions as public safety, planning, zoning, community development, maintenance of public streets and property, financial operations and budgets, recreational activities, inspection services, code compliance, water/sewer and storm water utilities operations, solid waste collection, parking and Clerk to the Town Commission related functions.
3. Prepares the annual Town Budget for submission to the Town Commission. Submits recommendations to the Town Commission for their discussion and approval concerning the efficient operation of the Town government. Prepares Town Commission agenda. Keeps the Town Commission informed of general Town operations and activities. Makes plans and recommends future programs of the Town Strategic Planning.
4. Maintains community respect through frequent public information in multiple formats and by keeping residents informed of Town progress and polices. Discusses problems and complaints concerning Town operations with the taxpayers or refers to appropriate official for action.
5. Directs the media relations activities.
6. Engages in complex contract negotiations, both labor and civil.
7. Participates on Non-Town committees.
8. Evaluates direct reports' performance and directs staff development activities.
9. Represents Town in local, state and federal relationships
10. Negotiates development agreements for all major new construction.
11. Supports community development.
12. Performs other duties as assigned.

*(These essential job functions are not to be construed as a complete statement of all duties performed. Employees will be required to perform other job related marginal duties as required.)*

## MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

### KNOWLEDGE, ABILITIES AND SKILLS

- Knowledge of laws and administrative policies governing municipal activities and operations of municipal government.
- Ability to delegate authority, responsibility and to mentor subordinate department heads and to maintain an effective organization.
- Ability to express oneself clearly orally and in writing.
- Ability to appear before groups of taxpayers and the Town Commission to present data and programs which enhance the continued efficient operation of the Town.
- Ability to provide strong relationships with key decision makers in the South Florida area and in Tallahassee
- Ability to build consensus with often disparate views on the Town Commission and the community.
- Knowledge of construction process for major capital programs.
- Ability to negotiate with collective bargaining unit.
- Knowledge of Park and Recreation programs.
- Knowledge of beach restoration process.
- Working knowledge of website, social networking and electronic access to payment procedures and information retrieval.

# Lt. Rory Alberto Selected For Prestigious FBI Academy

Lieutenant Rory Alberto has been selected by the Federal Bureau of Investigation to attend the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia.

Lieutenant Alberto is the first Surfside Police Officer to be selected to attend the most prestigious law enforcement academy in the world. Surfside Police Chief David Allen attended the National Academy as a Major for the Miami Beach Police Department. Leaders and managers of state and local police, sheriffs' departments, military police organizations and federal law enforcement agencies are nominated. Participants are drawn from every state in the union, from U.S. territories and from over 150 international partner nations. Participants must pass a demanding security clearance and background investigation procedure.

The FBI National Academy is a professional course of study for U.S. and international law enforcement leaders that serves to improve the administration of justice in police departments and agencies at home and abroad and to raise law enforcement standards, knowledge, and cooperation worldwide. Its mission is "to support, promote, and enhance the personal and professional development of law enforcement leaders by preparing

them for complex, dynamic, and contemporary challenges through innovative techniques, facilitating excellence in education and research, and forging partnerships throughout the world."

Classes of some 250 officers take 11- week undergraduate and/or graduate college courses at the Quantico, Virginia, campus in the following areas: law, behavioral science, forensic science, understanding terrorism/terrorist mindsets, leadership development, communication and health/fitness.
