Strength of Surfside Pension Good News for the Town

If municipal pension plans were given a grade, the Town of Surfside's Retirement Plan would earn an A+.

In a study conducted by the Leroy Collins Institute of more than 500 Florida Municipalities that manage their own employee pension plans, Surfside is one of only 47 municipal pension plans recognized as top performer and one of nine municipalities in all of Florida that has more than one plan (for both General Employees and Police Officers) with a top grade.

For the calendar year 2016, the Town of Surfside Retirement Plan earned \$1.8 million or 10.1% (+9.7% net), well ahead of the strategic model (+8.7%) and ranked in the top 2 percent of all plans. This financial stability of the Town's pension plans ensures that the future of Town employees' pension is secure.

This is also great news for Surfside residents, knowing that tax dollars are being invested with prudent care and professionally managed at the highest level under the leadership of the Pension Board.

Building Permits are Required

Planning to build a new house or demolish a building? Adding a room to your existing house, enclose a garage, or make repairs or improvements that involve trade workers? Florida law and Town Codes require that you first apply for and obtain a Town of Surfside Building Permit prior to commencing work. Florida Statute 553.79 states that *"it is unlawful for any person, firm, corporation, or governmental entity to construct, erect, alter, modify, repair or demolish any building within the state without first obtaining a permit thereof from the appropriate enforcing agency ..."*

Start the Permit Application Process

Obtain a Town of Surfside Building Permit Application Form, available at Town Hall and on-line: www.townofsurfsidefl.gov. Important: to add, remove or make any changes to any electrical, plumbing, mechanical, structural, or roofing system or components of a structure, you must hire and use a state licensed contractor to co-sign the applicable building permit application and do the permitted work.

Review and Approval Process

- Submit the building permit application with all necessary documents to the Town's Building Department for an extensive review.
- Plans examiners review the application's description of the scope of the work, the area that the work will be done, and the details of the work to be performed.
- If the plans examiners find any problems with the building permit application or its permit plans, then the permit application will be denied.
- You will be notified of the denial.
- You must revise the plans to make the necessary corrections.
- Re-submit the corrected plans for another review to the Building Department.

Final Steps

- When the Building Permit Application and plans are approved, you will be notified to come to the Town's Building Department to make a payment of the required permit fees.
- Upon payment, you or your contractor of record will be issued a permit card which authorizes the commencement of work.
- The initial permit card is valid for 180 days from the permit issue date.
- Work is expected to commence and continue until the work is completed.
- Your contractor will need to call the Building Department periodically to request Town of Surfside inspectors to make in-progress and final inspections of the work.
- Failure to call for an inspection within 180 days of commencement of work, or if work is suspended or abandoned for 180 days or more will automatically invalidate the Building Permit.
- You must re-apply for a new Building Permit and pay another permit fee if invalidated.



Commission Action at the February 16 Meeting

Voted to approve the following Resolutions:

1. Supporting United States Congressional Bills S. 279 and H.B. 833 to amend Section 935 of the Water Resources Development Act of 1986 to facilitate the use of foreign offshore sand in beach nourishment projects; urging the United States Congress to expedite and fund the study to allow foreign sand to be used in beach nourishment in Miami-Dade County.
2. Approving an addendum to the agreement dated October 6, 2014 between the Town of Surfside and Calvin, Giordano & Associates, Inc. (CGA) to render additional services as set forth in CGA work authorization No. 100 to perform information technology, website hosting and multimedia services; authorizing the expenditure from the 2016/2017 fiscal year budget in the amount of \$125,000 from the general fund.
3. Approving an addendum to the agreement with Harrington Resources Inc., dba Parker Systems on November 9, 2016 to procure eight additional pay stations to replace 48 single space meters presently installed in the town; amending the town's budget for

fiscal year 2016/2017; authorizing the appropriation and expenditure of \$95,080.80.

4. Amending the Fiscal Year 2016-2017 Tourist Resort Fund Annual Budget to fund four 2017 Summer First Fridays events; appropriating funds in the amount of \$48,000.
5. Supporting the implementation of Active Design Miami: Design and Policy Strategies for Healthier Communities as developed by the Miami Center for Architecture and Design (MCAD); directing the Town Clerk to transmit a copy of this resolution to the Board of County Commissioners of Miami-Dade County, all municipalities in Miami-Dade County and the President of the Miami Center for Architecture and Design.


Voted to approve the following Ordinances on Second Reading:

1. Establishing a temporary moratorium on cannabis dispensing businesses as further defined herein.
2. Amending Chapter 2 "Administration" Article VII "Code of Ethics"; specifically creating Section 2-227.1 "Honor Code for Elected and Appointed Town Officials and Town Employees."

WHAT RESIDENTS NEED TO KNOW

Solid Waste Information

Surfside residents should be aware of the following Solid Waste collection procedures listed below:

- Solid Waste is collected from residential properties five days a week (Monday-Friday).
- Residents are no longer required to place containers on the curb for collection.
- All garbage and recycling MUST be placed outside on side of the property or in front of the garage the night before by 6:30 p.m. or the morning of pick-up by 7 a.m. to ensure pick-up.
- All containers placed on the side of property must be placed in front of the fence or the garage. (Any container placed behind a fence whether accessible or inaccessible will NOT be collected).
- All garbage MUST be bagged and tied securely before placing in the container. (Residents MUST purchase a garbage container for trash collection).
- All trash and recycling must be contained inside the trash or recycling cart. If you have extra, hold it until the next scheduled collection.
- Only BAGGED household garbage can be placed in the containers. NO rocks, dirt, construction debris and NO flammable materials.
- Please wash your cart out periodically with a garden hose. You are responsible for keeping the container in clean and sanitary condition.

RECYCLING

- Clear, green and brown glass from food or beverage containers, aluminum and tin, steel, and plastic containers with a 1 or 2 recycling symbol imprinted on them, aerosol cans and newspaper.

- DO NOT put electronics, toys, computers, hazardous waste & bulky items in your recycling cart.
- DO NOT place food scraps and household garbage in the recycling container. It WILL NOT be collected.
- Hazardous/Household chemicals are collected at special dates and times specified by the Public Works Director. Check the Town's website, Gazette and Channel 77 for the special drop-off date and time.
- Batteries and electronic equipment can be brought to Town Hall for disposal.

LED Lighting Gives Downtown Surfside a New Glow

The Harding Avenue street lights in the Business District were recently replaced with new and efficient LED lighting. The lighting was installed by Emerald City USA who started a pilot program in Surfside. The Town's antique street lights were using 175W lights and the new LED lights are 70W. The new bulbs will give the Town an estimated 70% reduction in operation cost with an estimated 13-year operating lifespan.



2016 Crime Report from Surfside Police Department

The Town of Surfside Police Department Uniform Crime Report (UCR) is submitted to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement biannually and annually. The FBI uses UCR to track crime nationwide. The crimes recorded are murder, sexual battery, robbery and aggravated assault (violent crimes) and burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft (property crimes). Surfside experienced an overall increase in crime in 2016, because of additional property crimes such as burglaries and thefts from construction sites, hotel rooms unlocked vehicles and bicycles. Aggravated assaults increased from six in 2015 to 11 in 2016 and many were domestic related. Arrests also increased from 136 in 2015 to 183 in 2016.



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
