## BEACH RENOURISHMENT PROJECT UNDERWAY IN SURFSIDE

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and contractor Continental Heavy Civil Corp began the highly-intensive and monumental task of renourishing the public beach in Surfside on Monday, August 19, 2019. While the project is underway, residents should know it is necessary for a number of reasons, including:

- Coastal storm risk management, including beach erosion control and hurricane surge protection
- Protection of coastal buildings and infrastructures
- Preserving the wildlife that call the public beach in Surfside home
- Supporting tourism, recreational activities, quality of life for residents and the economy

## CODE COMPLIANCE CORNER

### HEDGES AND HEDGE HEIGHTS

The Town's Zoning Code defines hedges and hedge height requirements. A hedge is defined as a dense row of evenly spaced shrubs planted to form a continuous, unbroken visual screen.

Under Code Section 90-56.9, hedges shall be no more than four (4) feet in height in the front yard and side corner yards, and ten (10) feet in height in the rear and interior side yards. Hedges may be higher if granted approval from the Town's Planning & Zoning Board on a case-by-case basis.

Shrubs and hedges must be maintained in a manner that plant materials do not obstruct clear sight triangles and promote vehicular and pedestrian visibility. Also, hedges planted along property lines shall be maintained and trimmed to prevent branches from extending over and/or touching structures on adjacent properties.

Finally, all landscaped areas shall be sufficiently fertilized and irrigated to maintain the plant material in a healthy and viable condition. For information regarding hedges and hedge heights, please contact the Code Compliance Division at (305) 861-4863.

### SURFSIDE POLICE DEPARTMENT FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF LAW ENFORCEMENT UNIFORM CRIME REPORT JANUARY-JUNE 2019

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement Uniform Crime Report for January to June 2019 has been released. The numbers reinforce that Surfside is a very safe community. Violent Offenses and Property Offenses are compared to the first six months of 2018. Total Violent offenses decreased from 4 to 2. Total Property Offenses increased from 37 to 65. The increase in property offenses is related to a number of bicycle thefts early in the year. Detectives made an arrest in connection with the bicycle thefts and the trend stopped. The SPD clearance rate for all Index Crimes increased by 3.2%.

## JULY OFFICER & CIVILIAN OF THE MONTH

### Acting Sgt. Campbell Takes Charge of Critical Incidents

On July 18, 2019, officers responded to a male on a construction site who was possibly electrocuted. Acting Sergeant Tammy Campbell was the supervisor on duty and immediately assumed command. Despite the best efforts of Miami Dade Fire rescue the victim was pronounced deceased on scene. Acting Sergeant Campbell ensured witnesses were isolated from other workers, summoned detectives to the scene for interviews, and made sure OSHA was notified of the incident and responding.

Minutes later, a second call for service was broadcasted in reference to a suicidal male armed with a handgun. The information received was a male was on the telephone with a crisis counselor and parked in a vehicle in the area of 94th Street and Collins Avenue. Acting Sergeant Campbell cleared the construction accident scene and immediately responded to the area of the male in crisis.

After locating the vehicle, Acting Sergeant Campbell coordinated communication via the dispatcher to give the male specific instructions prior to exiting his vehicle. After a few minutes, the male began to exit the vehicle. Acting Sergeant Campbell directed officers on scene and issued verbal commands to the male, who was taken into custody without incident. Officers located a loaded firearm in the vehicle. The male was transported to the hospital for further evaluation.

The following day, the male wanted to retrieve his firearm. Officers discovered the subject had additional firearms in his vehicle that was parked at the police station. Acting Sergeant Campbell established a good rapport with the male who subsequently made the decision to turn over all his firearms. These events are examples of Acting Sergeant Campbell's leadership and calmness in times of crisis. She managed two critical incidents back to back seamlessly and priori-



## PUBLIC WORKS QUICKLY FIXES A BROKEN WATER MAIN ON COLLINS AVENUE

While the Public Works Department was inspecting roadway conditions, water was found coming out of the cracks at the intersection of 95th Street and Collins Avenue. It was determined to be an emergency water main break. Surfside Police closed the streets so Public Works could address the situation. The cause was an abandoned air release valve (more than 50 years old!) that had broken. The valve was removed and capped, and a temporary asphalt patch was quickly installed to restore all traffic lanes by 4:30 pm.

The quick response of Public Works resulted in only five properties affected. Because the water in the system retained its pressure, no boil advisory was needed. A special thanks to Public Works staff Kenny Chaviano, Felix Alvarez, Harold Lacriox, Frantza Duval, Randy Stokes and Hector Gomez.

## ANNUAL RESIDENT PARKING PERMIT PROGRAM

RENEWAL COMMENCING TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 3, 2019

Parking Permits will be available for renewal commencing on September 3, 2019 for the upcoming fiscal year of October 1, 2019 to September 30, 2020. They will be available at Town Hall during business hours between 9:00 AM – 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday.

**Note: The annual parking fee will be waived ONLY for the active or retired military residents. Proof of military service is required (DD Form 214).**

### REGISTRATION PROCESS:

1. Residents are required to complete a Registration Application (on reverse side). The application is on the website, and in the Gazette for September 2019 and October 2019; the application can also be completed at the Front Office counter in Town Hall.
2. Residents are required to provide proof of residency. Examples include, but are not limited to:
  - Property tax bill
  - Utility bill (FPL, Water/Sewer)
  - Property Rental or Lease agreement
  - Current Driver's License with a Surfside address
  - For active/retired military: DD Form 214
3. Residents are required to bring their current year's vehicle registration certificate. The vehicle must be registered in the name of the Surfside resident.
4. The Permit Fee is \$10.70 per permit/decals, sales tax included.
5. There is a maximum of three (3) parking permits per household. The decal will have a permit number printed on it and a space available for the license plate number to be entered by the Customer Service Representative.
6. Residents will be allowed to change the decal if the license plate number is the same as the original decal purchased within the same fiscal year at no charge; if the license plate number changes a new decal will need to be purchased.

### ANNUAL RESIDENT PARKING PERMIT RULES: PARKING PERMIT:

- > are NOT valid on Harding Avenue (9400 & 9500 blocks)
- > are limited to four (4) hours a day in any location
- > cannot be used for all day
- > are NON-transferable and NON-refundable
- > WILL NOT be issued for rental cars or Motorcycles



## 2019 SEA TURTLE NESTING SEASON INFORMATION

If you observe an adult sea turtle or hatchling sea turtle on the beach, follow these rules and guidelines:

- Stay away from crawling or nesting sea turtles. Nesting is a critical stage in the sea turtle's life cycle. Please leave them undisturbed.

- DO REPORT all stranded (dead or injured) turtles to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission.

- NEVER handle hatchling sea turtles. If you observe hatchlings wandering away from the ocean or on the beach, call: 1-888-404-FWCC or \*FWC (Mobile Phone)

- NOTE: With the Surfside Beach Renourishment Project underway, staff from the Miami-Dade County Sea Turtle Conservation Program have proactively relocated sea turtle nests to safe self-release locations on nearby beaches. If nests are found, they will be relocated.

New Community Center ID Cards and/or Renewal of ID Cards  
Renewal Commencing on Tuesday, October 1, 2019 for the upcoming fiscal year  
of October 1, 2019 to September 30, 2020**

**Process:**

- If the resident is the owner of the property, he/she must bring in his/her driver's license and two of the following documents (Residents that are renewing must also provide his/her Surfside ID):
  - Current Utility Bill
  - Current Bank Statement
  - Current Credit Card Statement
- If the owner of the property has multiple owners, proper documents must be presented indicating ownership of multiple owners. \*Subject to approval
- If the resident is a renter, he/she must bring in his/her driver's license, and a copy of the lease including the dates of rental and people authorized to reside at the property, and one of the following documents (Residents renewing must also provide their Surfside ID):
  - Current Utility Bill
  - Current Bank Statement
  - Current Credit Card Statement
- If the resident is a renter without a valid lease, the owner must fill out the Temporary Community Center Access Form and have it **notarized**; which must include the dates of rental and people authorized to reside at the listed property.
- The renter must provide the **notarized** Temporary Community Center Access Form, and his/her driver's license and one of the following documents: (Residents renewing must also provide his/her Surfside ID)
  - Current Utility Bill
  - Current Bank Statement
  - Current Credit Card Statement

**\*Access to the Facility may be denied upon three notifications and failure to renew your ID card.**

**Community Center ID Cards expire on an annual basis and are valid from October 1<sup>st</sup> to September 30<sup>th</sup> of each fiscal year for owners. Renter ID cards expire at the conclusion of the lease or September 30<sup>th</sup> – dependent on which date occurs first.**

**Everyone 18 and older must provide current proof of residency.**

**Community Center ID Cards are limited to one family per address (Owners or Renters).**

**Adult family members and siblings is not defined as a family eligible for ID cards.**

**There is a \$5.00 charge for lost, stolen or replacement cards.**

**Community Center ID Cards are issued to children 5 years and older.**

**All children in the system will have photos taken and may need periodic updating.**

**Parental Proof may be required for ages 17 and under.**

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
