Francis Bacon wisely once said "Knowledge is power."

As your current commission works to successfully complete the promises we made during our campaign (outlined in last month's Gazette), and to enact protections which will keep Surfside as it is, and not as those who wish to simply profit off of our paradise wish it to be... we continue to ask, how can we do more?

The answer is, we need to keep our financial house in order, and that means looking closely at financial pitfalls that we all can fall into. One of those pitfalls is to never write blank checks, or make financial promises you cannot afford to keep.

Enter **Surfside's Pension fund**. Before I get started on this subject, let me set the table. Surfside has a defined benefit system, or in other words, Surfside promises to pay pensioned employees who qualify, a monthly stipend, related to the highest amount they had earned annually while working, for the rest of their lives.

How is that supposedly accomplished? Supposedly by the employee and the town each contributing a little every month towards a fund that will then presumably pay the former employees, an ever increasing amount, for the rest of their lives.

Back in the day, when I was a young mayor, our pension fund was over 100% funded, meaning there was a good chance that the money in the bank <u>might</u> be able to pay all of the retired employees. Our promise to employees was to pay them a little more than half of what they were most recently earning prior to their retirement – for the rest of their lives and, have that amount continue to <u>increase</u> each year thereafter.

Over the last 20 years, some of your elected officials, not yours-truly, felt that the existing plan needed to be much, much more generous. So, what did they do?

They changed the rules...which now allow some employees to retire from Surfside, but still continue to get paid, for the rest of their lives, at the rate of nearly 100% of their most recent wage before retiring. Those elected officials also <u>reduced</u> retirement ages, <u>and</u> allowed overtime earnings to be included in the calculation to further pump up the lifetime retirement payment.

So where has that currently left us? Today our fund is only a little over 70% funded, because of investment decisions our pension board has made. Distressingly, our residents are ultimately responsible to write a (big) check to restore that fund to 100% and further, to continue to guarantee that all promised payments, regardless of whether the fund can pay the amounts or not, are made to all retirees. Residents are the ultimate guarantors for money owed to retired employees.

But there is more concerning news. Even if Surfside wrote the check today to fix the current pension deficit, a check which, depending on "assumptions" would come close to equaling a year's worth of property taxes that Surfside normally collects, residents could still owe <u>more</u>. Obviously, you can see how serious the current problem already is, but that's not all.

If for some reason the fund again went down by 25%, 50%, or more, Surfside would again find itself on the hook to replenish it...clearly something that would not be feasible.

In summary, while defined benefit plans are common, they are now, after being in place for some time, starting to fail on a national, state and local level.

Social Security is a form of a defined benefit plan and is projected to become insolvent in less than 10 years, according to the most recent annual report from the Social Security Board of Trustees, released on May 6, 2024. Or in other words, the money in the Social Security savings account will be all gone in 2035.

The State of Florida is in the same boat. The Florida Retirement System (FRS) Pension Plan, also a defined benefit plan, has a unfunded pension balance of almost \$40 billion, an amount equal to half of the State's annual revenue.

Given the foregoing, as mayor, and someone who needs to share the good, and the not so good news with residents, I believe that Surfside needs to talk about this issue.

This is why will be making a presentation at the commission next month. After having done so, I will have done my part in presenting the facts to our elected officials and residents, who can then decide how they wish to proceed.



If you zoom in on iNaturalist's map of Surfside, you'll see a bunch of color-coded markers that record biological sightings: green markers for plants, red for insects and spiders, blue for larger animals. Taken all together, the app provides a beautiful new perspective on our Town, and on a group of individuals working together to seek knowledge and to appreciate natural beauty. During their time in the state capital, the Youth Council members met with Florida Senators Shevrin Jones and Jason Pizzo. The discussions focused on several active Senate bills, particularly those related to education and environmental protection. BAL HARBOUR BEACH RENOURISHMENT PROJECT SCHEDULED FOR NOW - SEPTEMBER 2025

The Village of Bal Harbour is expected to begin its beach renourishment project with the US Army Corps of Engineers in mid-April with an anticipated completion date of mid-September, 2025.

The project will place approximately 225,000 cubic yards of beach-quality sand from an upland source along the critically eroded shoreline of Bal Harbour just north of Surfside.

Residents should expect heavy truck activity on the hard pack at 96th Street as sand-hauling vehicles make their way through to the beach.

Work is scheduled to take place Monday through Friday, sunrise to sundown.

SMART RECYCLING IN SURFSIDE

Recycling is an essential first step toward reducing waste in your household, but many people often misunderstand the rules. Knowing what can and can't be recycled, as well as how to properly prepare your items, is crucial.

Did you know that recyclables can become contaminated when items are placed in the wrong bin, or when food containers that still have residue are thrown into the recycling? Contamination can prevent large batches of material from being recycled properly. Additionally, non-recyclable items in your recycling bin increase the cost of recycling, slow down the process, and pose safety risks at the recycling facility.


Many items collected for recycling actually can't be recycled. These often end up being incinerated or sent to landfills. When in doubt, it's always better to throw it out.

3 KEY POINTS WHEN RECYCLING:

- Recycle bottles, cans, paper, and cardboard. Materials like newspapers, magazines, plastic bottles, aluminum cans, and similar items are recyclable.
- Keep food and liquid out of your recycling. Be sure to rinse off food or liquid residue from your recyclable items before placing them in the bin.
- No loose plastic bags and no bagged recyclables. Keep plastic bags out of your recycling bin. They
 can often be recycled at your local grocery store—like Publix on Harding Avenue.

Still unsure about what can be recycled? Come ask the experts at the Town's Earth Day Resource Fair on April 27, 2025, from 10 a.m. to noon.

Have electronics or hazardous materials you need to dispose of? Check out the Town's Hazardous Waste Drop-Off Event on May 10, 2025, from 9 a.m. to noon.



Please follow our guidelines for acceptance and proper disposal:

- Containers should be leak-proof and securely closed.
- Do not mix different waste materials
- All material that is loose (i.e. batteries) must be bagged.
- All bio-hazardous waste/ medical waste must be secured and shall be placed into the sharps container by the resident

ACCEPTED:

• Used automotive fluids, household chemicals, fertilizers, pesticides & herbicides, paints & solvents, pool chemicals, electronics and batteries

NOT ACCEPTED:

- Mercury thermometers or any products containing mercury
- Ammunition of any type (for ammunition drop off, please contact the Surfside Police Department (a) (305) 861-4862

SARGASSUM SEASON ARRIVES WHAT SURFSIDE RESIDENTS SHOULD KNOW

Spring marks the return of sargassum seaweed along Surfside's shoreline, a natural and essential part of South Florida's coastal ecosystem. The seasonal brown algae typically appears from March through October and plays a key role in supporting marine life and shoreline stability.

Sargassum plays an important role in the coastal environment. It provides food and shelter for marine species such as fish, crabs and sea turtles, and serves as a vital foraging area for migratory birds. While harmless to humans, sargassum can emit an odor as it decomposes and may be considered a nuisance to some beachgoers. Residents and visitors are reminded that sargassum is protected by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection and cannot be removed with heavy machinery without proper permits.



Without your support, the survival of sea turtles on the planet is uncertain. Here are some ways you can help sea turtles:

- Please respect sea turtles natural behaviors and share the beach. Do not approach or harass nesting sea turtles or hatchlings. Although large reptiles, nesting sea turtles scare easily.
- Never interfere or pick up hatchlings emerging from nests or walking on the beach. Without the right permits, this is a violation of the law. Hatchlings have limited energy reserves. If you observe hatchlings travelling away from the ocean, call FWC at their 24 hour wildlife hotline: 1-888-404-FWCC (3922) or *FWC (*392) from your mobile device or our nighttime response line at 786-719-6836 or our stranding response line at 305-310-3046.
- For necessary lighting keep it low, shielded, and long. Keep lights low to the ground, pointed downward and shielded from sight from the beach. Sea turtles cannot see long wavelength light well, changing bulbs to amber or red LED reduces the chance for disorientation
- Keep County beaches and waters clean. Properly dispose of garbage don't litter! Sea turtles may mistake debris for food. Imagine the resemblance between a floating plastic bag and a jelly fish!
- Stay clear of marked sea turtle nests on the beach. It is a violation of state and federal law to disturb a sea turtle, its nest, eggs or hatchlings. If you encounter a person poaching or vandalizing a nest, call the local police or FWC (1-888-404-3922 or *FWC from your mobile phone). Do NOT try to interfere or stop the event yourself.
- Don't use bonfires, flashlights, flash photography or video camera lights on the beach at night. Bright lights can disturb and cause disorientation of nesting turtles and hatchlings.


