# Commission Corner



## SHLOMO DANZINGER MAYOR

Dear Neighbors, It has been just over a month, and there has been a great deal happening behind the scenes as the new commission works diligently to rebuild areas of our government that had been neglected over the past two years.

Among the more pressing discoveries were that Surfside was in imminent risk of having the state assume control of our finances, as our required state audit report had not been filed since 2024. Additionally, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) had been on the verge of issuing a moratorium on sewer services due to failing stations that had gone without proper maintenance. Our operations had fallen into a state of disrepair, and we have been working steadily behind the scenes to address these deficiencies. We have also taken meaningful steps to resolve the numerous outstanding lawsuits filed against the town, doing so in a manner that protects residents from financial burdens we simply cannot afford.

On a positive note, this past commission meeting marked the passage of one of my key campaign initiatives: the restoration of the Budget Committee. This committee exists to bring **transparency and resident oversight back to government spending**, which has grown well beyond acceptable boundaries. I encourage any resident who meets the eligibility and professional requirements to apply and serve as a steward of our town's finances. We are currently in our budget cycle, making this a particularly critical time when your contribution can make a real difference for Surfside's future.

Speaking of town finances, I recently had the opportunity to meet with Florida's Chief Financial Officer, Blaise Ingoglia, who championed the Florida Agency for Fiscal Oversight, known as FAFO. The initiative was created to audit and curb wasteful government spending across the state. FAFO measures responsible

growth by comparing a government's total operating budget from 2020/2021 to 2025/2026, with an allowable increase of 36.22%, which accounts for 25.5% total inflation, 5.72% population growth, and a 5% government inefficiency buffer.

At the culmination of my first term in office, Surfside's total operating budget had increased 30.64%, rising from \$29,926,295 to \$39,096,814 between 2020 and 2024. That growth was responsible and well within FAFO's acceptable parameters. Over the subsequent two years, however, Surfside's total operating budget increased by an additional 54.82%, climbing from \$39,096,814 to \$60,527,735. When viewed across the full period **from 2020/2021 to 2025/2026, Surfside's total operational budget growth reaches 102.26%, more than double what FAFO** considers responsible, and 66.04% above their acceptable threshold.

Fiscal responsibility was a cornerstone of my campaign, and the dramatic budget increases of the past two years make clear why oversight is so urgently needed. These added expenses must be identified and addressed so that Surfside can return to compliance with state standards before we draw the attention of FAFO. The commission's foremost obligation is to serve as responsible stewards of this town's finances, managing our resources in a way that accounts for growth and plans thoughtfully for the future. Over the coming months, as we work through the proposed 2026/2027 budget, we will be focused on delivering on that commitment to you, our residents.

Beyond our financial priorities, we are also actively advancing our traffic initiative, which was among the most consistent concerns raised by residents throughout my campaign. We are in the early stages of developing meaningful solutions to improve traffic flow and safety throughout our community, and I look forward to sharing more details with you as that work progresses. There is much to be hopeful about in Surfside, and this commission remains fully committed to tackling the issues that matter most to the people we serve.

Surfside is especially proud to welcome many of these visitors as they stay in our town, experience our beautiful beaches, support our businesses, and enjoy the hospitality that makes our community so special.

Here in Surfside, the Town Commission remains focused on issues that matter most to residents. At recent meetings, traffic has continued to be a central topic of discussion. Identifying ways to improve flow, enhance pedestrian safety, and preserve the quality of life that makes Surfside unique remains an important priority. As regional events bring increased activity to our area, the Town will continue working with our partners to address transportation challenges and advocate for practical solutions.

The Commission has also been discussing long-term infrastructure needs. Commissioner Andrea Travani has shared ideas focused on helping the Town prepare for future demands through thoughtful planning and strategic investment...*Continued in page 5...*

## ANDREA TRAVANI COMMISSIONER

Growing up in Italy, I was always fascinated by American culture. There was something about its optimism, its energy, and its exuberant way of life—especially in the 80s and 90s—that deeply resonated with me. Even the music of the American national anthem always struck me as evocative and inspiring: the sound of a Country united around the idea of “We the People.”

As we approach America's 250th anniversary, I believe it is important to reflect on how we truly perceive this country and the idea of democracy itself.

Democracy is messy, clumsy, and inefficient. But it also offers a gift that outweighs everything else: public participation.

Precisely because we have provisions such as the Sunshine Law, meetings run long, debates stretch on for months, and decisions can sometimes feel slow or frustrating. Some of this can certainly be improved, and as elected officials, we have a moral obligation to make public administration more effective, more transparent, and more responsive.

But we must never lose sight of the true nature of government: it exists to serve the public, and it depends on public participation.

At times, citizens may feel that government is distant, irrational, or spending money on things that do not appear to make sense.

Sometimes that criticism may be fair; after all, we all make mistakes. But sometimes it is also a matter of perception. And when that perception grows unchecked, it can turn into deep distrust.

That is dangerous.

We should always remember that our institutions represent all of us. Politicians come and go, and every citizen should feel free to criticize, question, and participate. But the idea that our institutions are fundamentally flawed or corrupt is simply wrong.

The day-to-day reality of government is made up of many people—employees, public servants, volunteers, and elected officials—who are trying their best to serve the greater good. Government is, in many ways, a public company whose bottom line is not profit, but service. That alone should shift how we perceive it.

Every decision, expenditure, source of revenue, organizational change, and policy is publicly available. As in every area of life, there will always be some politicians or managers who do something unethical or illegal. But the vast majority of those who work in or volunteer for government do so because they believe in service, community, and the greater good.

As we celebrate a quarter millennium of this Country, I hope we take a moment to remember the value of the very institutions that shaped America and made it possible for us to be here today, with our families and loved ones.

Happy birthday, America, and happy 4th of July to everyone!

Surfside is a wonderful, magical place to live, every day of the year. But with each passing year, I become more convinced that the Fourth of July is the single best day of the year in our Town. No other event brings our community together in the way that the Fourth of July does, as Surfside's two greatest public resources—our beach and our beachside Community Center—

become gathering places for the entire community. Stepping onto the 93rd Street beach just before the fireworks begin, you can feel the joyful optimism and the gratitude that connect us as Americans and as Surfsideers.

The object of our beachside celebration—the metaphorical “birth” that we celebrate on America's birthday—is the Continental Congress's adoption of the Declaration of Independence. There are other moments we might have chosen to mark America's “birth”: the opening shots of the Revolutionary War on April 12th, 1775, perhaps, or the surrender of the British Army on October 17th, 1781. ...Continued in page 6...

Continued from page 5... But we, as Americans, have chosen instead to celebrate words. In celebrating the Declaration of Independence, we celebrate a document that expresses our shared ideals, a document that historian Jill Leopre calls “arguably the most important piece of prose in modern history.”

Wrapped up in our Fourth of July celebrations, then, there’s a certain irony. We come together to celebrate words, but in our celebration, words—public words and carefully written words, I mean—play a very small role. The Fourth of July is a party, and it’s a feast for the senses: music, the tastes and smells of cookouts, the bright lights and loud explosions of fireworks. Don’t get me wrong: I love that party! But as we get ready for it, I hope we’ll take some time to appreciate the ideals whose written expression we celebrate.

And June is perfect for just that kind of reflective preparation. In a nice coincidence, the deadline for this Gazette column was June 11th, which marks another, much less famous American anniversary: June 11, 1776, was when Thomas Jefferson was appointed to write the Declaration of Independence. So, in the

period of time between this writing and the Fourth of July, we mark the gestation and the composition of the written document that we celebrate on America’s birthday. Those 35 days provide important opportunities for reflection. The Juneteenth holiday and Stonewall Day both represent our country’s ongoing efforts to realize the ideals of the Declaration of Independence and to achieve the “more perfect Union” to which our Constitution aspires. And here in Surfside, the anniversary of the Champlain South collapse on June 24th reminds us of a painful loss that will always be part of our shared story.

In my opening remarks at the June Commission meeting, I paid tribute to two women whose lives and whose recent deaths are still on my mind as I write this column. Regina (“Jean”) Rosenfield, known to many as Mayor of Bal Harbour, taught me U.S. history at Beach High, where she was a beloved member of the faculty for decades. And Ruth Shack, a Dade County Commissioner from 1976 to 1986, was a tireless champion of the ideals we celebrate on July 4th. I am profoundly grateful to both of these women, and I will be thinking of them on Independence Day.

## SURFSIDE RESIDENTS PARTICIPATE IN ANNUAL HAZARDOUS WASTE DROP-OFF EVENT



The Town of Surfside Public Works and Solid Waste Division successfully hosted its annual Hazardous Waste Drop-Off event on Saturday, May 16, providing residents with a safe and convenient way to dispose of hazardous household materials ahead of hurricane season.

Held at the Town Hall parking lot from 9 a.m. to noon, the event welcomed dozens of residents who responsibly discarded items including paint, batteries, electronics, household chemicals and medical supplies.

The initiative was designed to help protect public health and the environment by encouraging proper disposal of potentially dangerous materials that should not be placed in regular household trash.

Accepted materials included anti-freeze, fertilizers, propane tanks, paint and paint thinner, household pesticides, batteries, pool chemicals and used motor oil. Electronics were also accepted during the event. Public Works staff assisted residents throughout the drop-off process to ensure all materials were properly sealed, secured and handled according to safety guidelines.

The annual event also served as an opportunity to encourage hurricane preparedness by helping residents safely clear hazardous materials from their homes before the start of storm season. The Town thanks all residents who participated and recognizes the Public Works and Solid Waste team for organizing another successful community environmental initiative.

In June, Mayor Shlomo Danzinger met with Florida Chief Financial Officer Blaise Ingoglia to discuss the proposed tax amendment expected to appear on the November ballot. The discussion centered on the potential fiscal implications of the measure and its role in shaping the state's long-term budget priorities.

Both officials emphasized the importance of maintaining strong fiscal oversight to help prevent wasteful government spending while preserving affordability for Florida residents. The conversation reflected broader concerns about balancing responsible budgeting with the need to protect taxpayers as the state continues to grow.

### Celebrate Safely: Fourth of July Fireworks Safety Reminders

Fireworks are a Fourth of July tradition, but they also pose serious safety risks. Each year, thousands of people are injured in fireworks-related incidents, with children among the most affected. Fireworks also cause thousands of fires nationwide, resulting in significant property damage.

As you celebrate Independence Day, keep these safety tips in mind:

- Purchase fireworks only from licensed vendors and follow all manufacturer instructions.
- Know the law. In Miami-Dade County, fireworks that fly, explode or detonate are illegal to sell or purchase. Florida residents who legally obtain these fireworks elsewhere may only use them on July 4, Dec. 31 and Jan. 1.
- Light fireworks outdoors on a flat, paved surface at least 25 feet from homes, vehicles, trees and other flammable materials.
- Never aim fireworks at people, pets or crowds.
- Only adults should handle and ignite fireworks. Light one at a time and move away immediately.
- Never carry fireworks in your pocket or light them inside metal or glass containers.
- Do not attempt to relight a malfunctioning firework.
- Closely supervise children around fireworks and sparklers. Sparklers can burn at temperatures of up to 2,000 degrees and can cause serious injuries.
- Avoid loose-fitting clothing and tie back long hair.
- If clothing catches fire, remember: Stop, Drop and Roll.
- Soak used fireworks in water before disposal.
- Keep a garden hose, bucket of water or fire extinguisher nearby.
- Never use fireworks while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

A few simple precautions can help ensure a safe and enjoyable holiday for everyone. Have a happy and safe Fourth of July.

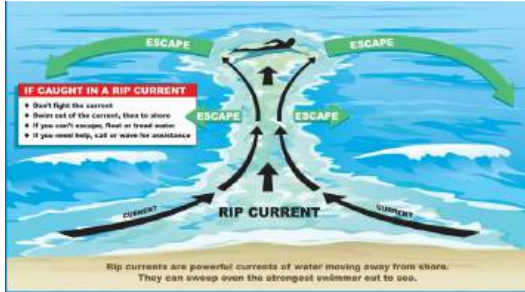

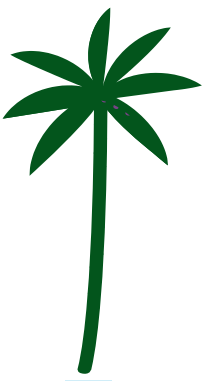

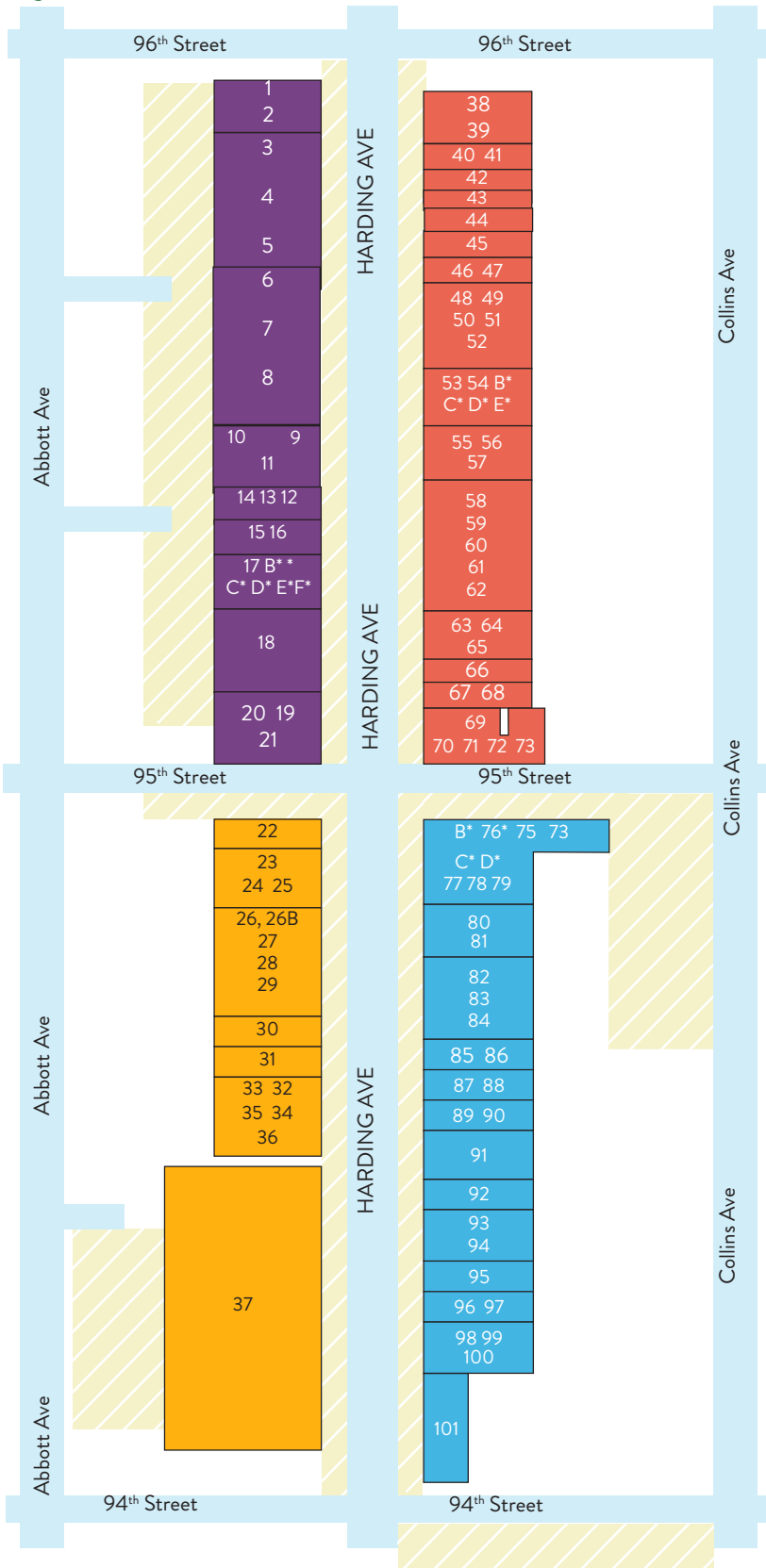
