A beautiful pedestrian-friendly oceanfront community located in South Florida's subtropical paradise. Surfside is home to nearly 6,000 residents and has an attractive residential neighborhood featuring multi-family condominium and apartment buildings, and a charming business district, as well as public art, award-winning restaurants, resorts, spas and recreational facilities enjoyed by residents and visitors year-round.

As a resident, you get to enjoy our beautiful scenery and bustling downtown all year. Harding Avenue, the center of our Business District, is home to dozens of small, locally owned shops and restaurants that will quickly become favorites on your list.

The Town of Surfside, Florida is a Commission-Manager form of government.

The Town Manager is the chief executive officer and head of the administrative branch of the Town. All Town administrative departments, such as Finance, Public Works, Planning & Zoning, Parks and Recreation, Code Compliance, Human Resources, Clerk's Office, Police and Communications fall under the leadership of the Town Manager.

The Legislative Department consists of the Mayor, Vice Mayor and three Town Commissioners. Collectively, the legislative body is responsible principally for setting the general policy direction of the Town. The Town Commission appoints and oversees the Town Attorney, Town Manager, Town external auditor and Town boards/committees members.

HISTORY

The Town of Surfside was incorporated in 1935 by 35 members of the exclusive Surf Club, which was renowned for hosting glitterati events and major celebrities, including Frank Sinatra, Elizabeth Taylor, Dean Martin and Winston Churchill. At the time, there were only 50 residents and a few buildings.

Spearman Lewis, Surfside's first mayor, and the Commission envisioned a seaside town that incorporated resorts, residences and businesses, which is not so different from the Town today. Surfside made history in 1976 when it elected its first female mayor, Marion Portman, who was also the first female mayor in all of Miami-Dade County.

Surfside began emerging after World War II and by 1957 had outgrown its original Town Hall. The current Town Hall was renovated in 2001 and serves as a hub of public services, and includes the Town Commission chambers, the executive offices of the Town Manager, Town Clerk, Public Works Department, Building, Code Compliance, Finance, Human Resources and Police Department.

In 1962, the Town built its first oceanfront Community Center at 93rd Street which was later replaced by a world-class recreation facility in 2011. For the enjoyment of all Surfside residents, the Community Center boasts a multipurpose room, green space and butterfly garden, children's activity pool, pool with lap lanes, jacuzzi, and concession stand.

Community and recreational facilities also include the Tennis Center, 96th Street Park, Hawthorne Tot Lot, Paws Up Dog Park, Veterans Park and Community Garden. A popular summer camp program initiated over 35 years ago still operates today.

Today, our oceanfront community encompasses the area from 87th Terrace to 96th Street, between the City of Miami Beach to the south and the Village of Bal Harbour to the north. Surfside's charm is its walkability--making it easy to stay fit and live more sustainability. You can find everything in our downtown district with grocery shops, clothing stores and health and beauty options, all within a friendly walking distance.

Surfside has been home to notable authors and songwriters. Its most famous literary resident was Isaac Bashevis Singer, the renowned Yiddish poet and writer who received the 1978 Nobel Prize in Literature.

Coincidentally, Surfside's streets west of Harding Avenue are named after famous literary figures, including Edwin A. Abbott, Lord Byron, Charles Dickens, Ralph Waldo Emerson, Richard Hurrell Froude, Hamlin Garland, Nathaniel Hawthorne, and Washington Irving.

PARKS AND RECREATION

Get moving and get to know your neighbors through ongoing programming and events hosted by the Parks and Recreation Department. Various social, physical fitness and cultural engagements help support the Parks and Recreation Department's commitment to bring neighbors together.

In the heart of Surfside is the oceanfront Community Center, a hub of exciting activity. Swim laps, splash around with the family in the children's activity pool, relax in the jacuzzi and enjoy savory and sweet treats from the snack bar. Resident ID cards are required to enter the Community Center.

Additionally, the Community Center offers health and wellness classes, sports, after-school programs and camps for kids and teens and regularly holds activities for senior citizens. To the east of the center, an open green space is the perfect setting for party rentals and community events.

The Parks & Recreation Department also oversees the following:

- 96TH STREET PARK The Town's signature parks boasts a brand new two-story recreational building with multipurpose space for programming, camps, aftercare and special event rental space. The park also includes a kayak launch, a multi-purpose field for athletic sports and special events, a custom-designed playground, basketball courts, a handball/tennis wall and more. (Location: 9572 Bay Drive; open daily from dawn to dusk)
- HAWTHORNE TOT LOT This ideal play area for children six (6) and under was custom redesigned in 2023 by the award-winning FRPA Gold Member team of Dominica Recreation/Gametime. It features a sand pit, two large play apparatuses, swings, picnic tables, and benches. (Location: Intersection of 90th Street and Bay Drive; open daily from dawn to dusk)
- **PAWS UP DOG PARK** The perfect spot for your furry friend. (Location: Corner of Byron Avenue and 93rd Street; open daily from dawn to dusk)
- VETERANS PARK AND TENNIS CENTER Offering three lighted courts for recreational and instructional play. In addition, the park area serves as a pleasant public space where annual events are held for Veterans Day and Memorial Day. (Location: 8750 Collins Avenue; open daily from 8 a.m. - 10 p.m.)

Are you a runner? You will find a walking/jogging path flanked by a pristine beach right behind the Community Center.


RESIDENT SAFETY

BUILDING, CODE Planning & Zoning

Before planning to build or renovate your home or business, it is important to understand what building permits you might need and how to obtain them. The Town of Surfside's Building Department, Code Compliance Division and Planning and Zoning Division are here to guide you. Office hours run from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, at the Town Hall lobby counter.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT

The Building Department provides a full range of services to both residents and the construction community with the goal of ensuring that buildings protect the health, safety and welfare of the people who live and work in the built environment. The responsibilities of the Building Department include the administration and enforcement of the Florida Building Codes by reviewing plans, issuing permits, performing field inspections, and issuing Certificates of Occupancy.

CODE COMPLIANCE DIVISION

The Code Compliance Division's mission is to fairly and consistently enforce the Town of Surfside Code of Ordinances. In addition, the Division strives to promote and protect the health, safety, welfare, and quality of life of residents and businesses of the Town by educating the community, enforcing applicable laws and municipal ordinances, and assisting affected parties to achieve compliance.

The Division responds to complaints and monitors residential areas, commercial districts, and the public beach for code violations. Common code violations include but are not limited to property maintenance standards, overgrown lots, unpermitted/illegal construction, sign regulations, beach furniture operations, and marine turtle lighting regulations.

PLANNING DIVISION

The Planning Division is responsible for reviewing all plans for new development or modifications to existing development. The Planning Division provides a number of services to the residents and commercial property owners of the Town to ensure compliance with the Town's codes.

PUBLIC WORKS

The Public Works Department is responsible for the effective management and maintenance of the Town's roadways, infrastructure systems, and facilities, as well as the management and supervision of the solid waste collection operation and the storm water and water/sewer utilities. The department also responds to and assists other Town departments in emergencies and instances of severe weather preparation and recovery.



TRASH & Recycling

Cleanliness and sanitation is top priority in the Town of Surfside. For a list of items that may or may not be recycled, visit the Public Works Department page on the Town website. HURRICANES & FLOODING

As a coastal community, Surfside is vulnerable to storm surge, King Tides and flooding during severe weather events. That is why the Town has put several measures and procedures in place to guide residents through hurricane preparations and evacuation procedures, if necessary.

Sign-up for AlertSurfside on the Town website to receive updates during an emergency and visit townofsurfsidefl.gov to view all the resources available.

Prior to a hurricane, residents who need skilled nursing care, assistance with daily living or have life-saving medical equipment dependent on electricity can register with Miami-Dade County's Emergency & Evacuation Assistance Program to ensure help is available. TOURISM

Surfside's Tourist Bureau, aka Visit Surfside, promotes the Town as a destination including its hotels, shops and restaurants thanks to funding by the Tourist Board. The Board also sponsors a high number of special events throughout the year, ensuring there's always something happening in Town. Visit @visitsurfside on social media to learn more.

Surfside is granted by the State of Florida to charge a Resort Tax of four percent (4%) on accommodations and two percent (2%) on food and beverage sales as a source of revenue. Resort tax revenue has yielded a number of positive benefits and projects for the Town of Surfside. For instance, a total of 66% of resort tax revenues is invested back into the operation of the Community Center, which is fully funded by this money, thus lessening the tax burden on residents.

ART IN SURFSIDE



Surfside's newest curated turtle sculpture, Ké, commemorates Surfside's first inhabitants, the Tequesta Indian tribe, and celebrates the environment. Ké, the middle syllable of the word Tekésta (Native American spelling), refers to planet Earth as turtles also represented "Grandmother Earth" in their culture.

The sculpture was designed by Aylin Chaparro in partnership with the Miami International University of Art & Design and funded and approved by members of the March 2020 - March 2022 Surfside Tourist Board.

INCONTRO DI LUCE SCULPTURE can be found at 94th Street Beach Entrance. This statuesque marble sculpture (Find Your Light) by artist Pablo Atchugarry is an elegant reminder to enjoy the Surfside sunshine. TURTLE WALK, public art sculptures along 93rd Street, help to bring awareness to the Town's beloved loggerhead sea turtles. Each turtle sculpture design was custom created by a local artist. Nesting season takes place from May to October each year in Surfside. If living by the ocean, residents are reminded to dim their lights at night during nesting season.



HARDING AVENUE BUSINESS DISTRICT



Surfside's business district on Harding Avenue and 94th and 95th Streets is the Town's bustling commercial corridor. The fully walkable "downtown" features a myriad of shops and restaurants ensuring you won't have to venture far to stock up at home, take care of errands, shop for a special occasion, or enjoy a night out with your family. Downtown includes grocery stores like Publix and The Grove (k), pharmacies like CVS, veterinary services, barbershops and salons as well as major banks like Citi and Chase. UPS and USPS are also conveniently located and offer mail and shipping services within Town.

Surfside might be a small Town, but not when it comes to culinary scenes. The two-block business district features more than 20 restaurants, kosher and non-kosher, of all cuisine types and price points, ensuring you'll find something for everyone.

PARKING

Surfside residents can apply for a free annual parking permit (limit 4 per household).

Surfside has six municipal parking lots and plenty of metered street parking. Residents with a valid parking permit can park free of charge at any municipal parking lot in Town (Except on the Harding Avenue lots).

Residential overnight parking is available to Surfside residents. This program allows Town residents to park their vehicles overnight at designated locations between the hours of 9 p.m. and 7 a.m. daily. Town Parking Permits must be displayed on front windshields. Residents are permitted to park overnight at on-street parking spaces, as well as Town of Surfside parking lots. There are some exceptions:

- No overnight parking in the Abbott Parking Lot
- No overnight parking in on-street spaces in the 9400 and 9500 blocks of Harding Avenue (Business District)
- No overnight parking in the on-street parking spaces in the 300 block of 94th Street between Harding Avenue and Abbott Avenue
- No overnight parking in the 300 block of 95th Street between Harding Avenue and Abbott Avenue
- No overnight parking in the on-street parking spaces in the 200 block of 88th Street between Harding Avenue and Collins Avenue on the south-side street adjacent to the Surfside Tennis Center.




